The decision to shut the NSW border with Victoria as of midnight Tuesday, has created confusion for locals who regularly travel between the states, often several times a day.

Under the new restrictions only permit holders, emergency services workers, freight drivers and returning travellers are able to cross into NSW from Victoria.

Causing further consternation has been the hard closure of the Towong and Tintaldra

Bridge crossings, forcing motorists to detour well out of their way, with only the Bringenbrong and Jingellic Bridges remaining open and being manned by NSW police.

Towong Shire mayor, Cr David Wortmann, has expressed his council's concerns regarding the impact the hard border closures will have on travel times.

"For example, if a Corryong ambulance is required to attend an incident in NSW this will add up to an additional or 50kms on top of a trip that fi is already 140kms to the m nearest hospital," he said. "This is simply not re

acceptable. "We are advocating on

behalf of residents to the NSW government to have these bridges manned, allowing residents to access the healthcare and other services."

The closure of the border has also drawn the ire of local politicians who blame the Victorian government's mishandling of the hotel quarantine fiasco for the draconian measures.

"This is the direct result of his botched hotel quarantine where his arrogance declined the support of the ADF to manage infected travellers," said Member for Benambra, Bill Tilley. "Our communities

have been incredibly disciplined and now we are paying the penalty for his government's failures after being COVIDfree for more than three

months."

Member for Northern Victoria, Tania Maxwell, said "The Victorian and NSW governments need to re-open the borders once Stage 3 lockdowns come into effect in metropolitan Melbourne, as there was no logical reason to restrict access for locals."

Travellers by bus from Corryong to Albury-Wodonga are also advised that they will be required to obtain a permit.

What was already a difficult situation for many has become so much harder with the economic impacts of coronavirus applying further pressure on our communities, particularly the many small businesses facing a loss of revenue and reduced visitation. These events, on the back of drought impacts, have reinforced the need for a strong, diverse and resilient local economy going forward.

In recent months, Regional Development Victoria (RDV) and Bushfire Recovery Victoria have been working closely with business and community, council and other Victorian Government agencies to understand the current challenges and opportunities as we look ahead to what will be a long process of economic recovery.

To date, the Victorian Government, through RDV, has invested over \$30 million through a range of infrastructure projects in North East Victoria. RDV continues to work in consultation with local Bushfire Economic Recovery Working Groups to set out the arrangements for coordinating and managing the planning and delivery of economic recovery activities across our fire-impacted communities. \$10,000 small business bushfire grants extended

Over 1500 small businesses and primary producers across fire-affected regions in North East Victoria and East Gippsland have successfully received the \$10,000 Small Business Bushfire Support Grant.

As of July 1, 150 applicants in Towong Shire have received this grant - and the application date has been extended to December 31.

The grant is available to businesses who have suffered a significant income loss as a result of the bushfires. This means businesses who were either directly or indirectly affected by flame can apply.

The grants have also recently been extended to the shires of Indigo, Wellington, Mansfield and Wangaratta - so if you have family and friends in this area, let them know what is available to them.

Clean-Up: Over 70% Of Upper Murray Properties Completed

Property clean-up in the Upper Murray continues to gather pace and is expected to be completed by the end of August (weather permitting).

Of 189 properties that required clean-up, work has started on 80% of properties and over 70% of properties have been completed.

Creative Recovery Small Grants Program

Bushfire Recovery Victoria - Grants for Community Facilities

Community groups across Victoria's bushfire-affected areas will share in funding to build or repair local community facilities such as playgrounds, skate parks, pavilions, community gardens and halls.

Community groups, not-for-profits, Aboriginal organisations and other social enterprises will be eligible to apply for the **Bushfire Recovery Grants for Community Facilities of up to \$50,000.**

Funding could fuel more fly-ins

The construction of a 24 hour self-service fuel facility for the Corryong Airport will not only assist with the provision of medical and firefighting air services but also opens up the region to new opportunities and economic benefits.

Prime Deputy Minister and Minister Infrastructure, for Transport and Regional Development, Michael McCormack, recently announced the \$262,000 grant from the Australian government under the Regional Airports Program

The program involves 60 regional airports sharing in \$41.2 million, intended to help the aviation industry to recover from COVID-19.

Mr McCormack said these upgrades, in bushfire affected areas, ensures the community is equipped to respond to future bushfire events and medical emergencies.

Towong Shire mayor, Cr David Wortmann, said the new fuel facility will support future emergency responses including firefighting and air ambulance, something that is so important when road

access is not an option. Cr Wortmann added that the 24-hour fuel facility will also provide new opportunities and economic benefits for the region.

"The fuel service will make the Corryong Airport precinct more appealing for commercial operators such as tourism charters or transport companies which recognise the huge potential of the Upper Murray market," he said. "It means we can now

invite and encourage commercial operators to take up occupancy of a hanger at the precinct." The Corryong Airport precinct was upgraded in 2019, with the new improved facility proving invaluable during the January bushfires for firefighting aircraft.

"We will continue to advocate for future opportunities for the airport to attract tourism and recreation operators, agriculture aerial services, private aircraft and aircraft maintenance," Cr Wortmann said.

Communities to set the recovery agenda

The process of establishing Community Recovery Committees (CRCs) for the Upper Murray is progressing and a planning meeting is scheduled for next Thursday to identify the priorities for the area, which encompasses parts of the Towong and Snowy Valleys shires.

More than 35 local residents and businesses responded to the callout from Towong Shire Council and Bushfire Recovery Victoria (BRV) to take part in establishing the recovery committees which will represent the needs of local communities, identify community projects to assist in recovery and community building, and play an active role throughout the recovery process.

About 40 people braved the cold and social

distancing to meet at in Cudgewa last Thursday night. After a constructive conversation it was agreed to delay forming a committee until the next meeting on Tuesday, July 28 at 6.30pm.

This was to allow more time to reach all residents in Cudgewa and immediate surrounds. An invitation will be issued by mail during this month. "This is the first step, to

formalise the Community Recovery Committees and establish a Community Recovery Steering Committee," said Nola Tudball, Towong Shire's Director of Relief and Recovery. "We will then

"We will then investigate what projects are happening now and what are planned or hoped for in the communities, allowing us to link similar types of projects and resources to maximise their efficiency and effectiveness.

"I am confident we can all work together to achieve the best outcomes for our local communities."

Ms Tudball added that recovery plans will be shared with the wider community for input.

Ms Tudball has worked as a practitioner, manager and leader in community and health service organisations and as a consultant in the public not-for-profit and private sectors. This included working with Yarra Ranges Shire Council following the 2009 Black Saturday bushfires, to review their recovery response.



Farmers face border issues

Following Monday's announcement by the Premiers of NSW and Victoria regarding border closures between the two states, the Victorian Farmers Federation (VFF) commenced urgent conversations with ministers and government agencies in both states to ensure this decision does not impact the industry or



Give police a chance

The ongoing effects of the January bushfires and coronavirus pandemic have only added to the workload of local police resources and the community is being encouraged to help reduce that impact when it comes to reporting non-urgent crime or events or general enquiries.

Corryong and Walwa police cover a remote area of approximately 5000 hectares which puts additional pressure on resources if there are two or more active incidents at the same time. They also provide backup support to NSW police when necessary.

Sergeant Liam Mc-Mahon of Corryong police said even with a full complement of officers, resources can sometimes be put under strain due to the unique demands of working in the area.

"The community can

help ease the pressure on our local police by reporting non-urgent crime or events via the Police Assistance Line 131 444 or online at police.vic. gov.au," he said.

The assistance line is a dedicated, public phone number for the community to report or get advice on non-urgent matters including:-

- Lost property
- Property damage PartySafe

The assistance line and online reporting services are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week to report non-urgent crime or to make general police

enquiries. "If community members take advantage of these new contact options they will help improve the response, management

and delivery of our local police services," McMahon said.

Funding boosts family counselling

Bunnings timber decision misses the mark

The recently formed Victorian Hardwood Sawmillers Association (VHSA) has condemned Bunnings' decision to immediately cancel orders for Victorian hardwood timber as a blow to manufacturing jobs that will do nothing for the environment.

VHSA spokesman, Leonard Fenning, said the decision was premature given VicForests has said there are strong grounds for an appeal and confirmed it will be appealing the Federal Court decision.

"Bunnings should allow for the due legal process to conclude before making such a drastic and immediate decision that threatens thousands of local jobs that depend on Victoria's sustainably managed native timber industry," Mr Fenning said.

"Anti-forestry groups have been aggressively targeting Bunnings for years with misinformation campaigns about Victoria's hardwood timber industry and it is disappointing that Bunnings has succumbed to these extreme activist groups.

"This is a lose-lose result for Aussie workers and the environment. Bunnings knows all too well that the sustainablysourced Victorian timber currently on their shelves will be replaced with imported timber from countries with poor environmental records and poor working conditions.

"Victoria's native timber sector generates approximately 2.500 direct jobs and thousands more indirectly.

It generates around \$770 million in revenue annually, with \$297 million value added in regional communities." Mr Fenning said the





🚯 Upper Murray Sport Funding gives clubs some confidence

The season might be over before it began for Upper Murray football and netball because of the coronavirus shutdown but the Corryong and Cudgewa clubs have received some good news on the funding front.
