Vaccination available for elders

The Corryong Medical Centre has received limited supplies of the AstraZeneca coronavirus vaccine to administer and appointments can now be booked for people aged over 70, until May 5, 2021.

It is expected that the vaccine will be available for those aged over 50 after that date.

"Corryong Health is working closely with Albury Wodonga Health, our Local Public Health Unit, as we progress with the schedule for roll out of both the Astra Zeneca and Pfizer vaccines," said CEO, Dominic Sandilands.

"We are yet to be

informed of the timeline to administer the Pfizer vaccine and further updates will be provided as they become known.

"The majority of our residential aged care clients have commenced their AstraZeneca vaccination and several of our staff have also commenced their vaccinations."

Eligibility for the vaccine is based on general health and you will be asked a number of questions to confirm your suitability (check at www.health.gov.au/initiatives-and-programs/covid-19-vaccines).

Mr Sandilands also said that Corryong Health

currently has influenza vaccinations available.

"Members of the public can simply advise our medical clinic or their GP if they wish to receive the flu vaccination and they will be advised of the clinic dates and be booked in," he said.

"No cost is incurred by community members when receiving either the Covid vaccination or the flu shots as they are covered by Medicare Billing.

"There is a minimum of two weeks wait between having the flu vaccination and the Covid vaccination or vice versa," Mr Sandilands added.

ABORIGINAL COMMUNITY MITIGATION AND CRISIS MANAGEMENT GRANTS ARE NOW OPEN

\$3.8 million is available for strengthening the resilience of Aboriginal communities in bushfire-affected areas.

Administered by Bushfire Recovery Victoria, the program has two streams, with \$1.8 million available for initiatives addressing crisis management, mitigation and planning, and \$2 million available to improve Aboriginal infrastructure to better prepare for future emergency events.

Under the \$1.8 million crisis management, mitigation and planning stream, grants of up to \$450,000 are available to support Aboriginal organisations to develop and

implement crisis planning and mitigation initiatives on bushfire-affected country.

Under the \$2 million improved Aboriginal infrastructure stream, grants of up to \$1 million are available for projects addressing the structural needs of bushfire-affected Aboriginal communities.

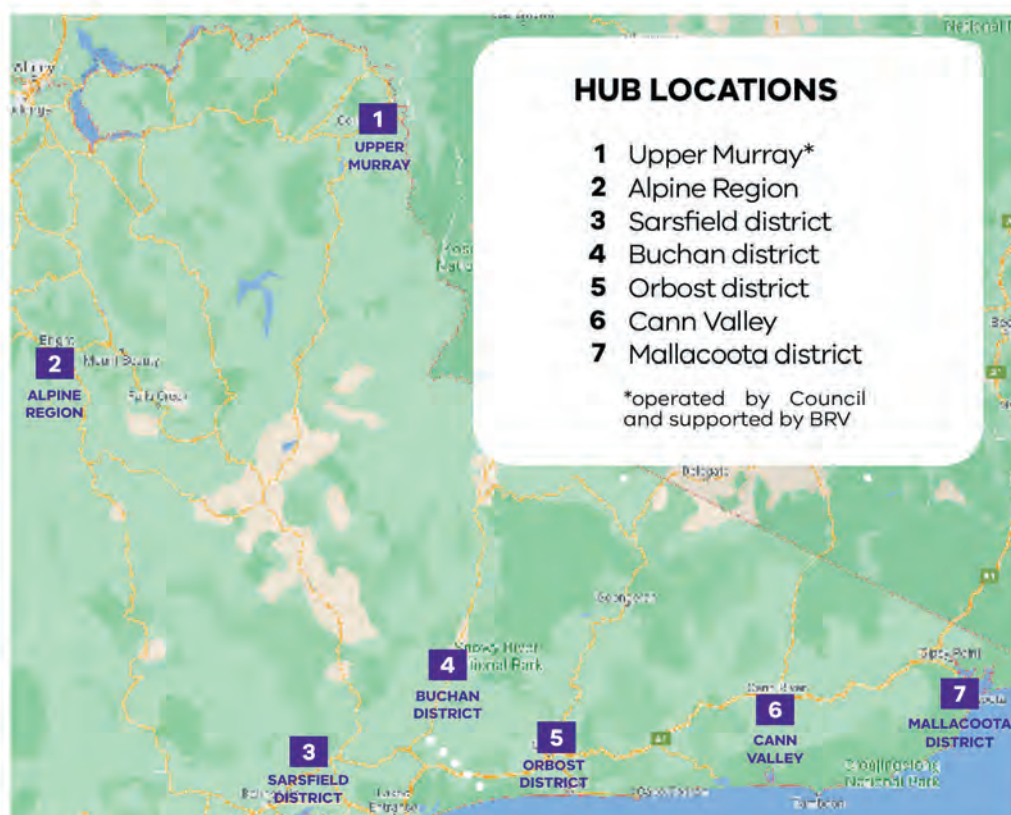

Pasture renovation tops the list

A not-for-profit community company focused on regional and rural development has opened an office in Corryong to assist with bushfire recovery for farmers, small business and fire affected landholders.

AgBiz Assist is well known locally for its work in assisting farm and small rural businesses with recovery and renewal, managing financial difficulties and providing relief to rural families.

It has opened an office at 81 Hanson Street in Corryong and appointed Keryn Sheather to the Client Support Officer position.

She is also the local contact for the *Re-seed Upper Murray Farms for Recovery Project* administered by Bushfire Recovery Victoria (BRV) which has obtained a grant to provide financial

assistance, pasture re-establishment information and re-seeding assistance to fire affected farmers and landholders in the Upper Murray who lost pastures in the 2020 bushfires.

AgBiz Assist is undertaking the task of distributing the funds because they are a registered charity, one of the few whose purposes enable financial assistance to farmers, small business and rural communities recovering from disasters.

In collaboration with BRV, Upper Murray Landcare Network, Agriculture Victoria and the Towong Shire Council they are sharing effort, knowledge and resources to help get the best possible result for farmers and landholders.

"Re-seeding has been identified by local farmers as being very important to the future productivity of farms throughout the

Upper Murray," Keryn said.

"AgBiz Assist understands that every farm business is different, has different production needs and different recovery needs.

"Although the funding available to distribute will only provide a small amount of assistance required, gathering information on farmers' and landholders' pasture recovery needs will provide essential information to base further applications for support by Ag Biz Assist."

Local event gets a shot in the arm after cancellation

The Corryong Show is receiving an Australian government cash boost to help it bounce back from Covid-19 cancellations.

Minister for Agriculture, Drought and Emergency Management, David Littleproud, said the

event has been awarded supplementary expense funding totalling \$6468 under the Supporting Agricultural Shows and Field Days program.

A total of 110 events across the country will share in the \$710,818 cash

boost as of this month.

"Our agricultural shows and field days are bouncing back from the pandemic because of the hard work of their volunteers and support from their communities," Minister Littleproud said.

North-east Victoria based Nationals Senator, Bridget McKenzie, said agricultural shows were at the heart of local communities and help farmers stay competitive by sharing innovation, showcasing their produce

We remember our magnificent seven

Of the 53 men and women from the Upper Murray who participated in the Gallipoli Campaign, seven were to lose their lives. A further thirteen would be killed or die from wounds or illness in the remaining years of the war.

This is a snapshot of the men who made the ultimate sacrifice at Gallipoli:-

Private Alex Baptie (1314):- Alex Baptie was born on 13 September, 1890 at Selkirk in Scotland.

In 1911, he boarded the ship S.S. Suffolk and travelled to Australia, disembarking at Sydney. At the time war was declared, Alex was working on a farm at Walwa. He enlisted on 4 December, 1914 at Liverpool in NSW.

Alex was a member of C Company, 1st Battalion, 1st Infantry Brigade, which landed on Gallipoli on 25 April, early in the morning. After spending some time in the firing line, the men were withdrawn to the beach to rest and re-organise. The rest was short lived and on the 1 May they relieved a Battalion of Royal Marines in two portions of the line. During the next few days the Battalion spent time working on the trenches it was manning. Although there were no major attacks by the Turks during this time, the Battalion was heavily shelled and Alex became a casualty. He has no known grave but is remembered on Panel 13 of the Lone Pine Memorial, Gallipoli.

Private Percy Clifton (627):- Percy was born at Turvey, Bedfordshire in England in 1891.

Percy was 23 years old at the time he enlisted. He did so in Sydney, NSW, on 26 August 1914. Percy was part of B Company of the 4th Battalion, which also landed at Gallipoli on 25 April. In early May, Percy injured his ankle and spent a little over two weeks in hospital back in Alexandria before returning to Gallipoli on 17 May.

On 6 August the 4th Battalion, of which Percy was part of B Company,

formed up at 3.15pm in preparation for the attack on Lonesome Pine. When the attack was launched at 5:30pm, B Company had initially been kept as the Battalion reserve. During the course of that day, B Company moved into the trenches at Lone Pine. It was here, between 6 and 9 August, that Percy was killed in action. Percy's body was not formally recovered and it is thought that he was buried in an unknown grave at Lone Pine.

Private Gilbert McCully (962):- Gilbert was born in 1880 at Yackandah.

Gilbert was 34 and a plumber when he decided to enlist in the AIF on 17 August 1914. His service number of 962 shows that he was one of the original men who answered the call to serve for 'God, King and Country'. Prior to embarking for overseas service, Gilbert, like the rest of the 6th Battalion that he was a member of, would have found himself on the wet and windy plains at Broadmeadows' Camp, just outside of Melbourne, training to become soldiers of the 1st AIF.

Finally on 19 October, 1914 the 6th Battalion embarked on H.M.A.T. A20 Hororata. Gilbert's service records become unclear at this point and the next known location we find him at is embarking from the SS Cawdon at Alexandria in Egypt on 29 July 1915.

Gilbert eventually found himself with the rest of A Company of the 6th Battalion in Bivouac, at the junction of Monash Valley and Bridge Road. The date was early August and the Anzacs were about to unleash their August Offensive on a number of locations.

On 7 August, the 6th Battalion was heavily involved in fighting in the Lone Pine area. While attacking the German officers' trench, Gilbert was wounded in action being shot in the groin. He was quickly taken back to Anzac Cove and eventually transferred to the Hospital Ship Caledonia. He was then

further transferred to the transport ship HT Ermine. Unfortunately, later in the day of 7 August, Gilbert succumbed to his wounds and died. Reverend Clarke buried him at sea the same day.

Private Charlie Hayes (1970):- Charlie Hayes' real name was William Henry Williams. He had a brother and a sister, both of whom were living in Tumburumba.

Charlie enlisted at Liverpool, NSW on 28 December, 1914 giving his age as 20 years old. After training, he embarked with the rest of the 3rd Battalion on H.M.A.T. A55 Kyarra at Sydney on 13 April, 1915.

After some training in Egypt, Charlie arrived at Anzac Cove in mid June, as a reinforcement for the 3rd Battalion. In August he was wounded with a gunshot wound to his left thigh. He spent some time in Egypt at the No. 1 Australian General Hospital recovering from his wounds before rejoining his unit on 30 October.

The 3rd Battalion spent November and some of December at a location called Shell Green, which was on the southern flank of the Anzac lines. The Battalions war diary for the 1 December mentions improvements being made to the trenches and chambers, as well as wire entanglements being placed out in front. At some stage during this day, Charlie was killed, either by shelling or from a sniper's bullet. He was buried in the small Shell Green cemetery.

2nd Lieutenant Ken Curlewis:- Ken was born in 1893 at

Tintaladra, to Alfred and Frances Curlewis. His occupation at enlistment on 30 September, 1914 was given as an electrical engineer.

When Ken landed on Gallipoli on 25 May he was a sergeant in the 14th Battalion, in the New Zealand and Australian Division of the 4th Brigade. During the next months he would be promoted to Quarter-master Sergeant, Company Quartermaster Sergeant and finally, be commissioned to the rank of 2nd Lieutenant.

A witness report in Ken's Casualty Report tells the story of the circumstances of his death. "About 5am on 8.8.15 they lined up for a charge on Hill 971. Lts Curlewis and Luscombe, Sgt Kilmartin, Bug, Morgan, and two other men, besides witness (Pte E.E. Bishop), were cut off from the rest of the Battalion. Lieut. Luscombe called for volunteers to follow him. They all (including Lt Curlewis) followed on to a ridge, which they held and sent back for reinforcements, which however they did not get as their messenger never returned. They held the ridge for about half an hour, and were then ordered by Lt. Luscombe to retire, which they proceeded to do.

Coming along a gully, Curlewis was hit in the back by a bullet from a machine gun. He fell, apparently dead and did not move. They tried to bring him away but could not manage it, so they left him. Witness was the only one of the party to get back. Lt Luscombe is, he says, a prisoner of war."

Ken has no known grave and is remembered on Panel 29 of the Lone Pine Memorial on the Gallipoli Peninsula.

Trooper Vivien Lees (834):- Vivien Ralph Worthington Lees was born on 30 August, 1888 at Moree NSW. Vivien enlisted in December of 1914 and embarked on H.M.A.T. A18 Wiltshire on 13 April, 1915, eventually arriving at

Vivien Lees was a

member of B Squadron of the 8th Light Horse. He had not long arrived on the Peninsula when he was wounded on his forehead by a bomb blast while the 8th was manning Walkers Ridge. He was transported to HMAS Sweeper on 27 June and was initially admitted to the 24th Casualty Clearing Station, before being transferred to the 57th Lowland Casualty Clearing Station on the island of Mudros.

He was returned to duty on 13 July. On 29 July the 8th Light Horse relieved the 9th Light Horse and occupied No. 1 and No. 3 post along Walker's Ridge.

Early August saw Vivien and the 8th on Russell's Top, occupying the trenches at the Nek. As part of the August Offensive, the 8th and 10th Light Horse were to attack the Turkish trenches at the Nek, hoping that the Turks attention would be drawn away from the British landings in the north at Suvla.

On 7 August, the now infamous attack took place. After the attack those remaining members of the 8th Battalion were withdrawn and taken into Bivouac at HQ Terraces. When the roll was called, Vivien did not answer his name. He was declared missing and eventually killed in action. The actual events and reason for his death was unknown.

but it was assumed he was killed by wounds sustained during the attack on the Nek.

He has no known grave and is remembered on Panel 7 of the Lone Pine Memorial on the Gallipoli Peninsula.

Private Horace Lennox (2316):- Horace was born in 1898 at Cudgewa to Hugh and Margaret Lennox. He enlisted at Melbourne on 19 April, 1915, embarking on H.M.A.T. A62 Wandilla two months later.

On 6 August, 1915 Horace landed at Anzac Cove where he joined his unit, B Company, 6th Battalion, 2nd Infantry Brigade, 1st Australian Division.

Re: Notification of 1080 Baiting Programs on National Parks Estate

As a neighbour to Bogandyra Nature Reserve, Clarkes Hill Nature Reserve, Jingellic Nature Reserve and/or Kosciuszko National Park, the National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) would like to inform you that NPWS will be continuing to undertake ongoing 1080 baiting programs in all of these reserves from 12th May 2021 until 12th November 2021. These ongoing programs will include the use of both baits and canid pest ejectors that contain 1080 poison.

As a component of the ongoing program aerial baiting, involving the deployment of 1080 wild dog baits, is planned to occur within these reserves between 12th May 2021 and the 14th May 2021. Also a fixed wing aerial baiting program will occur in the Kosciuszko National Park between the 5th May 2021 and the 7th May 2021. Should the weather postpone this operation, it will be undertaken on a suitable day soon after.

Please be aware that 1080 baits and ejectors are particularly lethal to domestic dogs and cats and as such you must ensure that pets and working dogs do not enter these reserves. In the event of accidental poisoning seek immediate veterinary assistance.

These activities are aimed at controlling wild dogs and foxes in accordance with the Upper Murray Wild Dog Management Plan and are being undertaken in conjunction with other stakeholders of the Upper Murray Wild Dog Working Group.

Horace Lennox
(pictured) landed in
time to participate in the
Division's attack on Lone
Pine.

The Lone Pine
operation was planned
purely as a diversion
aimed at drawing Turkish
reserves away from a
major attack to be launched
from the northern end of
the perimeter at a place
called Hill 971. The 6th
Battalion's War Diary for
the 7 August, written by
Lieutenant-Colonel A. J.
Bennett, states "All parties
having reported in position
signal was given to attack.
Immediately our men
emerged from the tunnel
enemy opened a heavy
rifle and machine gun
fire on us. The wounded
men attempted to return
through the openings
they had just left this
causing a serious block".
The Turkish trenches at
Lone Pine were heavily
fortified, having pine logs
placed over them and dirt
on top of that.

Horace's unit was
involved in the charge
from Steele's Point across
to the German officers' trench.
During this attack his
unit was unsuccessful in
reaching their objective.
Two other members of
his unit last saw Horace
during the charge. As they
never reached the German



trench, he could not have
been taken prisoner and
was listed as missing. The
morning after the attack
only 30 out of the 150 draft
answered the roll call.

An enquiry was held
on 24 April, 1916 where
Horace was presumed
killed in action. He has
no known grave but is
commemorated on Panel
26 of the Lone Pine
Memorial, Gallipoli.

Author's note:- These
names were obtained
through researching the
local Rolls of Honour.
While there is a lot more
information that has been
obtained about these men,
this article is designed to
provide a small snapshot
of how these men paid the
supreme sacrifice.

Health funds finally arrive

Haines lauds win for Upper Murray on mental health funding

The Member for Indi, Dr Helen Haines (pictured), has welcomed the Commonwealth government for finally fulfilling a promise to deliver mental health funding, almost 15 months since the original commitment.



Yesterday, the Health Minister, Greg Hunt, re-announced the delivery of \$338,000 for mental health services in the Upper Murray that he first promised in Wodonga on 15 January, 2020.

Dr Haines, who has run a dogged campaign to secure the delivery of the funding, heralded the win as much-needed victory for the Upper Murray:

"Anyone who knows the region, who was there in those terrible days in early January 2020, knows how hard those fires hit," she said.

"The mental health impacts have been huge. It's unacceptable that it took so long for this funding to be delivered but it's fantastic that we have finally secured it."

The news comes just six days after Dr Haines publicly demanded the Health Minister deliver on the commitment.

According to Dom Sandilands, the CEO of

Corryong Health, which will deliver the mental health services, the announcement delivers two-thirds of the original commitment that was outstanding.

"This money will be going towards implementing our Upper Murray Community Suicide Prevention Plan which is currently open to community consultation," he said.

Mr Sandilands said that in addition to the bushfire recovery funding, Corryong Health is seeking a commitment of ongoing mental health funding for the region.

"Even our basic mental health service is chronically underfunded. We need just \$295,000 a year to run our basic mental health services but right now we're only funded in small packages for a few months at a time. It makes it impossible to deliver a proper service for Towong and the Upper

Murray".

Mr Sandilands thanked Dr Haines for backing the Upper Murray and Senator Jane Hume for the funding support.

"People like Dom Sandilands at Corryong Health work absolutely tirelessly for their communities and they do it on a shoestring budget," Dr Haines added.

"We shouldn't wait until the next fire to properly fund mental health in the Upper Murray."

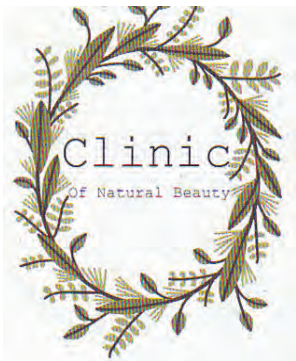

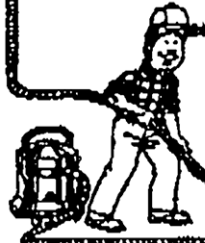

Demons storm home in derby



The absence of football and netball in Corryong since the 2019 season was the catalyst for a bumper crowd on Saturday that witnessed a classic contest between co-tenants Corryong and Federal, that remained in the balance until the final siren.

Rivalries were put aside prior to the senior game when footballers, netballers and supporters from both clubs and members of the 7th Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment observed a minute's silence in memory of two young Swans' players who have passed away in tragic circumstances in recent times - James Penman in February 2020 and Tom Sheather on April 13th.

An emotion-charged Federal outfit surprised their opposition from the jump with their clearance work and 'run-and-gun' tactics, getting out to a three-goal lead before the move of Sam Cross to the square resulted in him booting two majors, enabling the Demons to bridge the gap.

The umpires also had a hand in proceedings in the first term, dishing out several 50 metre penalties for players moving on the mark under new AFL rules. Once players adjusted it was evident that the game was more free flowing, contributing to a match total of 29 goals.

The second quarter was 'rinse and repeat' as the Swans continued their rapid ball movement, courtesy of some silver service tap work from their ruckman Kieran Brennan to Mitch Pieper, Andy Saliba and Josh Jarvis who were either kicking goals themselves or setting up others.

When Corryong did get the ball into attack its

forwards were wayward, the main culprit being new coach, Mitch Harris. However, once he got his eye in and Sam Cross stepped up again the margin at the long break was just four points in Feds' favour.

The third stanza was an arm wrestle as Matt McNamara and Tom Shanks repeatedly repelled the Swans' raids but then Feds kicked up a gear to push the three quarter time advantage out to 16 points. Saliba and Pieper (five goals) were running riot and the Dees seemed to be bereft of energy and ideas at the last break.

However, the Demons rallied in the last term as Thomas Nicholas started to nullify Brennan's influence at the stoppages and with the majority of play in their forward arc, the Dees piled on 5.7 to 1.1 with Harris kickstarting the assault with a clever dribble kick from the boundary for a goal and Cross slotting two long range bombs for maximum points.

The Swans were gallant as they tried to reel in the deficit but Corryong's defence held firm and the Dees got home by 14 points.

Tumbarumba caused the upset of the round by toppling flag favourites Bullioh by 32 points.

Brendon Lane led all scorers with six goals for the Roos while best-on-ground Harry Nunn added four majors in a polished performance.

Tumbarumba held a slender margin at each of the breaks but just as Bullioh was expected to put the foot down, it was the Roos who surged in the last quarter with a seven goals to three blitz.

In A grade netball, Corryong and Federal put on a stirring contest with the teams going goal for goal in the last quarter to record a 43-all draw.

Bullioh also had a battle on its hands before prevailing by three goals over Tumbarumba

Cudgewa hosts the Swans after having the bye and will be keen to add to its comfortable first round win. Feds speed will cause the Blues problems but overall depth should see Cudgewa home.
