Communities to pace recovery

Coordinator of National Bushfire Recovery Agency, Major General Andrew Hocking, was in Corryong on Monday with member for Indi, Dr Helen Haines, to meet local government, business and community representatives to learn firsthand about unmet areas of need in the Upper Murray.

Gen. Hocking said it had been difficult to get a feel for how communities were faring in the recovery process and what was still needed beacuse of the pandemic lockdown and border closures.


"It has been too hard to read feelings and emotions in Zoom meetings," he

"We've lost a sense of the soul of what's needed." He also said part of his

agency's role was to assist with bushfire recovery grants which had to be a community-led process.

"This about completing specific projects for individual towns and communities rather than a one size fits all approach," he added.

Important feedback from his visit was that because of the tough year people had endured and the restrictions they faced



in getting together as part of the recovery process, it had not been possible to meet some of the grants

"Some of these deadlines will be extended," he

"We will go at the community's pace in trying to meet their needs.

"I'm hopeful that as we listen and adjust, there won't be people that miss

Gen. Hocking and Dr Haines also visited the Bright community on Tuesday when the latter welcomed the broad new power for the Governor-General to declare a national emergency in

response to bushfires. However, she urged the Commonwealth government to pick up the pace on the Bushfire Royal Commission's recommendations before another disaster occurred.

Dr Haines voted in support of the National Emergency Declaration Bill 2020 last Wednesday, allowing declaration of a national emergencies of national significance.

"On 3 January 2020, in the height of the fires, I wrote to the Prime Minister urging him to declare a national emergency so that we could properly respond to the catastrophe unfolding,

with telecommunications infrastructure. aerial firefighting, electricity grids and military assistance," she said.

"Almost a year later, the government finally understands that it can't take the back seat in disasters - that in fact leadership by the Commonwealth is essential when we are facing threats like this."

In her speech to Parliament, Dr Haines said she was alarmed the Bill barely began to implement recommendations the of the Bushfire Royal Commission.

concerning

to me not just that the government has waited until the last possible moment to debate this important legislation but that we're going into the next season in essentially the same position as we went into the last one.

"We have no sovereign aerial firefighting fleet, no single app for sending out disaster notifications, no national register of fire and emergency services personnel and equipment and no inter-operable communications emergency services across jurisdictions.

"These were recommendations of the royal commission.

Open and honest feedback

The National Bushfire Recovery Agency met with the chairs of local Community Recovery Committees and the Upper Murray Recovery team earlier this week, one year after the Upper Murray bushfires. Major General Andrew Hocking, Deputy Coordinator, **Engagement and Operations** at NBRA was accompanied by Member for Indi, Helen Haines and Bushfire Recovery Victoria Executive Director of Recovery, Engagement and Operations, Megan Stiffler. Towong Shire Mayor David Wortmann also attended and took the opportunity to thank the CRCs for their efforts this year.

Major General Hocking said community-led recovery was not as quick as a 'top down' approach, but he was "absolutely certain" it was the right thing for the country.

"At times it's hard work on top of what has been a hard year. None of that is lost on me, but while it may be slower in the short term, it is far better in the long run" he said.

Community representatives and Council staff openly shared their experiences to date, particularly regarding difficulties with the grants process and their short time frames.

Major General Hocking said the day had given the NBRA a very grass roots sense of what could be improved and committed to working with the State Government to secure support for writing grant applications.

Fire inquiry continues

Police are still investigating a suspicious fire that gutted the interior of a family home in Cudgewa North around 8.45pm last Thursday.

Fire crews from Corryong, Walwa, Nariel Valley, Cudgewa and Tintaldra attended the fire but the home was ablaze when they arrived and the farmhouse was destroyed. Although the exterior walls remained standing, the interior of the home was gutted.

It took firefighters an

Corryong police and Wodonga detectives attended the scene and a police media spokesman said the fire was considered suspicious.

The cause of the fire is yet to be determined but a forensic chemist from the arson and explosive squad

as well as detectives from Wodonga attended the incident. Detectives visited the site again yesterday and investigations are continuing.

Hall upgrade will tell a story

The streetscape around the Corryong & District Memorial Hall and adjacent gardens are set for an upgrade after receiving \$25,000 under Bushfire Recovery Victoria (BRV) funding for community facilities.

The area is an important meeting place for the community and the grant will fund information panels, artwork and photos describing the bushfires in the region and how the community has come together afterwards.

Hall committee secretary, Ilma Clarke, said she is excited to be able to develop the streetscape after the work that has been done to improve the building itself including a new roof and verandah, acoustic ceiling and a sound system as part of a \$240,000 redevelopment project.

"We've been doing bits and pieces for the last eight years," she said "and this is one of the final works to really complete the project."

The works will also include seating viewing, lighting of the panels, the extension of a platform viewing area and the development of a grassed area.

Built by the community



in 1958 and opening in 1959, the hall provides a large, low cost venue with attached catering facility and concert hall with stage. The hall caters for a wide range of community events including sport, exhibitions, conventions and community meetings.

The historic hall was built with red bricks that were all made locally and more than four miles of hard wood timber that was

milled locally and donated to the community.

Victorian Minister for Police and Emergency Services, Lisa Neville, said the project "would help tell the story of what the community went through and how they recovered for generations to come."

Member for Northern Victoria Region, Jaclyn Symes, added that "The hall committee has worked hard over the last few years to improve the building and this streetscape work is a real testament to their community pride."

In addition to the hall upgrade, an interactive service directory for Towong and Alpine Shires is one step closer, with APMHA HealthCare receiving \$90,000 for the project.

The directory will people seeking support services

CEO Renee Hayden called the funding a "godsend" and said the directory has been identified as a top priority by recovery and wellbeing groups. Without it, we wouldn't be able to move to a website," she said.



Kids use their 'nüdels'

Students at Corryong College and Corryong Kindergarten experienced a Nüdel Kart extravaganza last week when Towong Shire Council brought Playground Ideas to the Upper Murray.

Nüdel Kart is a mobile play and learning space that explodes into more than 200 different research backed loose parts that children can explore and experiment with in endless ways. Communities that were affected by the Black Summer bushfires are now in a stage of regrowth and rebuilding and so are their children.

Kids can be amazingly resilient but they can't be forgotten as part of the rebuilding phase, so earlier in the year, nonprofit Playground Ideas, working with their major funder, Moose Toys, donated six Nüdel Karts to children in bushfire affected communities.

For children living with toxic stress and daily anxiety about their future, Nüdel Kart creates an oasis of low stress and stimulating play as soon as possible after trauma.

Fire money helps clubs get back on their feet

The cancellation of the Upper Murray Football Netball League (UMFNL) 2020 season, has provided an unexpected windfall.

The league was scheduled to receive 10 per cent of proceeds from the 'Footy for Fires' charity weekend in March for the benefit of those clubs that assisted the organisers of the event at Cudgewa ie. Corryong, Federal, Tumbarumba and the host club. It was revealed at the league's annual general meeting last week that given the

other support for bushfire recovery in the region and the effects of the coronavirus pandemic on the 2020 season, it was decided to make the balance of \$47,000 available for distribution to the above clubs or to the UMFNL for distribution as it sees fit.

The funding is being administered through the Upper Murray Innovation Foundation (UMIF) and it was emphasised that it cannot be provided for operational costs including, in the case of the UMFNL, payments for

players or coaches.

It was a case of 'steady as she goes' at the league meeting with incumbent president, Gordon Nicholas, being re-elected for his 31st consecutive term in the position.

Following the rejection of a league working party proposal for a merger of clubs and move to the Tallangatta league, which was only supported by the Federal club, it was expected that the league would continue with five football teams competing at senior level. Border-Walwa has gone into

recess for 2021.

The clubs were also working on having two junior grades, possibly under 11s and under 14s, however in a surprise move Cudgewa and Bullioh mooted that the reserves competition be re-established and Tumbarumba supported the proposal. These were the only clubs that fielded reserves teams in 2019 before it was decided to discontinue the secondlevel competition for the 2020 season.

Corryong indicated it had doubts about getting

enough players for a reserves side while the Swans flatly rejected the notion. There was also discussion about the Demons and Feds having a combined side at junior level. The 2021 season draw will remain the same as 2020 with the first round being played on April 17th.

In other league news, Nadia Edwards has been appointed as the league's Operations Manager, following the decision of AFL North East Border to hand the administrative role back to the league.






