Victorian government has enacted new measures to protect the state from the spread coronavirus deploying more than 700 police officers to man checkpoints along the border with NSW.

In a reversal of the conditions imposed by the NSW government when Victoria was in lockdown, the Greater Sydney and Northern Beaches areas have been designated as coronavirus 'red zones'. meaning people who live in those communities or have visited there since 11 enter Victoria.

Anyone from these zones found trying to enter Benalla,

Victoria in breach of this order will be subject to 14 day mandatory hotel quarantine.

Currently, the rest of regional New South Wales remains a 'green zone' but residents in these areas will still need to apply for and receive a valid permit to enter Victoria.

Those living in local government areas along the border will not need a permit but will instead be able to use their driver's license as a passport to travel between Victoria and NSW.

The local government December 2020, cannot areas in the border zone on the Victorian side are: Towong, Alpine, Bendigo,

Buloke, Campaspe, East Gippsland, Gannawarra, Indigo, Loddon, Mildura, Moira, Shepparton, Swan Hill, Wangaratta, Wodonga and Yarriambiack.

The NSW LGAs are: Albury City, Balranald, Bega Valley, Berrigan, Broken Hill, Edward River, Federation, Greater Hume, Hay, Lockhart, Murray River, Murrumbidgee, Snowy Monaro, Snowy Valleys, Wagga Wagga, and Wentworth.

In the Upper Murray, police are manning checkpoints on the Murray River at Bringenbrong, Tintaldra and Walwa/ Jingellic.

There is also a hard closure of Towong Bridge with barriers in place.

This bulletin provides regular updates and stories about bushfire recovery both in our local community and across Victoria's fire-affected areas. Bushfire Recovery Victoria proudly works in partnership with council and the local community to support bushfire recovery.



A number of key Commonwealth and Victorian Government bushfire recovery grants are closing soon, but there is still time to consider your options and get your applications in.

\$10,000 Small Business Bushfire Support Grant

The grant is available for **small businesses and primary producers who have experienced significant income loss** as a result of the 2019-20 bushfires, and are located in East Gippsland, Towong, Alpine, Alpine Resorts, Indigo, Wangaratta, Mansfield and Wellington Shires. 2243 businesses in these areas have already received this grant, with over \$22 million paid out.

Businesses both directly and indirectly affected by fire can apply. It only takes a few minutes to apply online. You don't need to upload financial documents if you don't have them right now. You can be assessed under exceptional circumstances if you don't meet the eligibility criteria. Grants close January 31. Apply at ruralfinance.com.au or call 1800 260 425.

\$75,000 Primary Producer Grant

The Emergency Bushfire Response in Primary Industries Grants of up to \$75,000 are available to **directly-impacted primary producers** in 19 Local Government Areas and the Alpine Resorts. 434 primary producers have received this grant to date, with over \$28 million paid out.

The **eligibility criteria changed** for these grants in June so more people can now successfully apply. If you made a self-assessment early on that you weren't eligible, please look at the grant information at brv.vic.gov.au or ruralfinance.com.au to see if this is still the case.

We are supported by the staff from the Upper Murray Recovery Hub, in particular Jai Edwards (Local Area Recovery Officer – LARO, Towong Shire), Tanya Aramini (Towong Shire) and Tracey Farrant (Bushfire Recovery Victoria)


Since forming we have adopted our Terms of Reference, developed our vision and mission statements, conducted a survey of the community, regularly met with other CRC chairs to share ideas, received a presentation from the Towong Shire Emergency Management Co-ordinator, lobbied for and participated in fire preparedness training and started to identify key priorities for the recovery of the Corryong community.

Our Mission: To ensure Corryong and the Upper Murray residents, groups and organisations have access to the information and resources needed to implement local recovery activities and programs that will create a safe, healthy and resilient community.

Meet Your LARO: Jai Edwards is Towong Shire's Local Area Recovery Officer (LARO) supporting Corryong CRC. There are four LAROs who work out of the Upper Murray Recovery Hub in the old primary school building. Staff at the Hub work closely with Bushfire Recovery Victoria (BRV). The Corryong CRC feels very lucky to be working with such a great team.

Community Survey: A community survey to find out your priorities and ideas for recovery projects and activities indicated a strong need to debrief after the fires and to feel prepared for the coming fire season.

The committee has held two vision workshops to identify its vision, mission and community priorities. These will be further explored in early 2021.

Grant Applications: Assessment of grant applications by outside agencies can be a rigorous and robust process. Your best chance for success is to have done your homework about your project before preparing the grant submission. A short video (featuring Lyn Coulston from Shelley) which can help you understand the need for good preparation is available at https://vimeo.com/444728545

Some grants require letters of support or endorsement from your local CRC. So we can best support your application, if you intend to ask the Corryong CRC for approval please make arrangements to present the project at a Corryong CRC committee meeting well ahead of submitting the grant application.

This will allow consideration of how your project aligns with community recovery priorities. Last-minute requests for support from the CRC may not be possible. It is important that your grant submission reflects the project as submitted to the committee.

Fire affected roads open

Works to repair roads and tracks in the Upper Murray area which were damaged in last summer's bushfires are continuing, with many re-opening for the summer holiday period.

Forest Victoria Management (FFMVic) staff and contractors are clearing, stabilising and repairing drainage along hundreds of kilometres of roads and tracks which were significantly impacted by the bushfires, burning than 220,000 hectares of public and private land.

FFMVic Upper Murray District Manager, Dave Jenson, said "One of our biggest concerns is the risk to visitors and our staff from fire affected trees.

"Our crews and contractors have been working hard to mitigate these risks by undertaking hazardous tree works to ensure that fire-affected

areas are safe for visitors to enjoy. We are happy to announce that some key roads and tracks will re-open for the holiday period

"However, others will remain closed while our crews undertake soil and stabilisation and hazardous tree works to reduce the risk to the public.

"Due to the impact of the bushfires, including flash flooding events, it may take some time for all fire impacted roads and tracks to be re-opened.

"It's really important that visitors to our area plan their trip in advance to ensure that they have the most up-to-date information about which roads and tracks are open," Mr Jenson warned.

"This is particularly important in remote areas of the high country which were impacted by fires."

The following key roads are open or planned to open prior to Christmas

A full-time bushfire lawyer, Harley Dannatt, has been employed in about legal problems the role with the Hume Riverina Community Legal Service (HRCLS)

Mr Dannatt has started visiting Corryong every two weeks, attending the

Corryong Neighbourhood Centre and Upper Murray Community Recovery Hub to speak to people they have faced after the January 2020 bushfires.

Rodgers, said the focus of his role would be to assist people with legal problems as a result of the January 2020 bushfires.

He would also be helping people with legal issues arising from the coronavirus pandemic.


Historically, legal issues have not affected people until months and even years, after the

"From what we know, problems don't appear straight away, so having a lawyer in the role for the next two years is vital for helping people who face issues cropping up long after the fires have passed," Ms Rodgers said.

This time last year many of us were concerned about the forthcoming fire season but nobody could have guessed that within a couple of weeks it had changed our lives. Instead of putting out fires, the much hoped for rain came at least two days too late, bringing more hardship to some with floods and mudslides. Those disasters were only the beginning of a year from hell.

No-one could have imagined 'recovery' would then take place against the backdrop of a pandemic with family members getting caught up in lockdowns, border closures, travel and social distancing and quarantine hotels in the cities.

It has been an angstfilled year for those of us with family members living in places where there is a high coronavirus incidence, with many of us having family members who are unable to return for Christmas.

Not surprisingly, only a couple of weeks short of the first anniversary of the Upper Murray fires, many feel almost too tired to celebrate the festive season. Yet Christmas seems to have gathered all the more significance because of all we have been through. Perhaps all we want is getting together with family and friends, never mind if some of the Christmas trappings are forgotten. Above all we're hoping that Christmas and New Year will herald better times.

Similarly 75 years ago at the end of WWII emotions were heightened as a conflict-worn community welcomed home those who had served, many of whom had endured years of unimaginable hardships, let alone injuries and illness. Bereaved families felt more than ever the

loss of those family members who weren't fortunate enough to have a homecoming.

Christmases during and in the aftermath of conflicts and natural disasters can be some of the toughest, leaving some of the most poignant memories.

In October 1945 my father Tom brought home in his scant luggage a Christmas card from the Changi prisoner-of-war camp (pictured). chose it perhaps for its prophetic note in the quotation, which read "To Tom Mitchell of Towong Hill - 'How beautiful upon the mountain are the feet of him that bringeth good tidings, that publisheth peace' (Is.52.7)", from A R Macneil, Changi Christmas 1944. Padre Macneil composed the 2/29th Battalion marching song during the unit's preembarkation training at Bonegilla.

During Christmas 1944 Tom and his mates from the Upper Murray and the other prisoners of war could only dream of freedom. In his diary Tom gives a detailed account of their meagre but much appreciated Christmas menu. Despite near starvation, Tom notes that he began to feel the 'gastronomic strain'. The following day he admits 'Have now had the squirters for 4 weeks and 2 days – it is a tiresome business. I have been in bed now 2 weeks – the first Xmas I have ever spent in bed.'

If this last year has given us the shits, at least our discomfort has not been brought about by starvation and disease!

The news of the Japanese surrender in

September 1945 brought the 'good tidings that publisheth peace'. With it came the chance of a new beginning, just as we are hoping that the roll out of the vaccine protecting against Covid-19 and Christmas 2020 and New Year 2021 will herald some kind of return to

normality.

Christmas arrives come hell or high water or in our case, fire, flood and then pandemic and border closures.

Sometimes it is the simplest Christmas greetings that mean most to their recipients - just like Padre Macneil's Christmas greeting to my father.

Roll on Christmas and New Year greetings bringing hope, good health and a plethora of other good wishes! As for the New Year, have a good
