

Dr Haines said Ms rcher was a true Liberal and had voted with the courage of her convictions.

"The Member for Bass has shown what integrity really is," she said.

"She has long spoken about the need for a robust federal integrity commission and she acted on that.

"If the government had been paying attention to the number of their backbenchers who have been pushing for progress on an integrity commission they would have seen it coming."





Sargeant met with challenging times

"What have I let myself in for here?" was Liam McMahon's reaction when he arrived as sergeant-incharge at Corryong five years ago.

"I learnt pretty quickly that it is a unique community which has great spirit and resilience," he said.

"In some instances you had to accept that it's just the Corryong way!"

Sgt McMahon's operations area covered 5000km² much of which is remote and steep terrain.

"It would be one of the biggest patches in Victoria and took all our resources to police effectively," he

"It is just not possible to staff the station for long periods because of the time necessary to patrol such a large area."

In his time at Corryong, Sgt McMahon was faced with many challenges and his fair share of bizarre incidents including paraglider and parasailing accidents, lost hikers, too many fatal crashes, increased drug use and a shooting in Corryong's main street.

"The shooting in Hanson Street on the evening of the Deb Ball in May 2018 was the most disappointing incident in my time at Corryong," he said

"It was like something out of the Wild West and we worked flat out in the weeks afterwards, particularly to ensure community safety."

In another tense situation Sgt McMahon attended an incident at a local school where an agitated man attempted to take his service pistol.

"It was very confronting but he was obviously having mental health issues," he said.

"I stopped him from taking my gun and managed to calm him down to an extent.

"I arranged for him to get treatment and eventually helped get him a job!"

Community safety has been a cornerstone of Sgt McMahon's tenure in Corryong.

"Keeping our community from harm was top of my list and I made no apologies for cracking down on antisocial behaviour," he said.

"Soon after I arrived in town we also had a serious domestic violence incident that highlighted an underlying issue in the community.

"Local police engaged with the Corryong and Tallangatta health services and community organisations to form the Upper Murray Family Vioplence Committe in 2016.

"We now have more effective mechanisms in place to better cope with family violence matters

including professional help for all parties involved.

"We have also been active in increasing awareness of the issue in the community such as making presentaions at local sports clubs and getting people to talk openly about it.

"It is pleasing to see that the incidence of family violence in the Towong Shire has continued to decrease in the past five years."

Sgt McMahon is also a supporter of the 16 Days of Activism campaign against gender-based violence which runs from November 25 to December 10 this year.

"Calling out family violence is everyone's responsibility and we all need to step up," he said.

Sgt McMahon added that community safety also extended to major events in the area and he had successfully worked with the organisers to implement operations plans including a certified safety plan.

"Everyone has got on board which is a big tick,"

One of Sgt McMahon's major regrets was that the family of murder victim, Ruth Ridley, has not had closure over her death.

Mrs Ridley was reported missing in October 2019 and the body of her estranged husband, Gary Ridley, was found a week later in his car near Shelley.

"I feel for her family as her body has not been found for them to lay her to rest," he said.

A highlight for Sgt McMahon over the period was the construction of Corryong's new police station.

"We were one of the first purpose-built stations of this design and I'm proud of what we have been able to achieve,' he said.

The past two years have been very testing for Sgt McMahon following the Black Summer bushfires and the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic.

"It's been a fairly emotional journey during the recovery process and particularly dealing with the ensuing increase in local youth suicide," he said.

"These tragedies combined with the effects of the pandemic has really tested the resourcefulness and resilience of the community and I'm optimistic that they will come through these times even stronger.

"The bushfires

identified that the Upper Murray needs to be a self sufficient community in times of disaster and a purpose-built evacuation centre is a priority.

Sgt McMahon added that a positive to come out of the experience was a greater emphasis on emergency management and co-operation between agencies.

"There is now a clear link between emergency services and they meet regularly to review their capabilities."

Sgt McMahon also said a key role for him had been supporting his staff.

"It is even more important in these times to look after their wellbeing," he said.

"You have to make sure you get that right."

Sgt McMahon has started duty in the Wimmera district and has noticed one big difference.

"Geez, it's flat out here!" he said.

"I will genuinely miss the Upper Murray and its people - some more than others!" he said with a grin. Sgt McMahon's stay in Corryong will be commemorated as he is one of the emergency services personnel depicted on the mural on the wall of the Corryong & District Memorial Hall.
