Health service gives all clear

A Corryong Health residential client who tested positive to Covid-19 on November 28 has now finished their period of isolation and subsequently, the lockdown at the facility has been lifted.

Bridge works remain on track

Despite some minor setbacks, construction of the new Towong Bridge over the Murray River is on schedule for completion in mid-2023.

The \$10 million project involves the removal of the old crossing which took place in June and replacing it with a safer, smoother bridge for the local cross-border community.

The new bridge will be twice the width of the previous one and includes a footway.

NSW Transport Project Manager, Peter Dawson, said the project is progressing after some early challenges around cold, wet weather and high river levels.

A temporary construction platform was put in place early in the project to allow a large 80ton pinjib crane to operate across the river.

"As of late November, there have been 12 piles placed and these have been topped off by concrete headstocks," Mr Dawson said.

"The aim by Christmas is to have the fourth headstock completed and ready for the pre-stressed girders to be placed in January and February.

"This is a significant milestone in the project as the structure will start to

look like a bridge."

Another important milestone before Christmas 2022 is the completion of a retaining wall to reinstate the river bank which has been scoured and slipped due to decades of flooding.

This will allow the construction of the abutment on the Victorian side.

Towong Road (NSW) and Towong Hill Road (Victoria) are closed for the duration of the construction. There is access for emergency vehicles.

Detours are in place via Bringenbrong Bridge or Tintaldra Bridge.

Memorial commemorates the human spirit



One of the casualties of the 2019-20 Black Summer bushfires which raged through the Upper Murray was the Avenue of Honour pine trees at Tintaldra which were planted by school children, in honour of men who had attended the local school and joined up to fight in World War I.

Inspired community members and the Tintaldra Recovery Committee, Corryong RSL, Towong Council, Border Trust and the Victorian government subsequently collaborated to replace the memorial with a thoroughfare of maple trees, signage and storyboards adjacent to the township's hotel.

Around 60 people and members of the Australian Defence Forces (ADF) attended the official launch last Friday.

The keynote address was given by Major Mark Robinson who emphasised

Devastated by the loss of their beloved gathering place, the people of Ournie rallied together to rebuild with a vision of a hall that everyone in the community could use for many years to come.

The Upper Murray community is invited to the opening and to enjoy a morning tea provided by the Ournie Hall Committee members.

Funding of \$740,000 was received under the Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund, co-funded by the Australian and NSW governments.

The Ournie Rural Fire Brigade received \$200,000 from Club Grants Category 3 Infrastructure, funded by the NSW Government and Snowy Valleys Council contributed \$120,000 from insurance allocations.

The National Anti-Corruption Commission (NACC) been has legislated by the Federal Parliament and will be established in the new year.

Federal Member for Indi, Helen Haines, has been a staunch proponent of the legislation and marked the occasion in Parliament as a significant victory for integrity and transparency in politics.

"This day has been a long time coming," Dr Haines said.

"It is a moment of

national significance and this legislation is a huge step in restoring trust and integrity to politics.

"This victory is for the people of Indi who have voted for action on corruption. This is for every person who has stopped me on the street and said 'don't give up on integrity, Helen'."

Dr Haines paid tribute to the former Member for Indi, Cathy McGowan, and other advocates who have worked hard over many years for an integrity watchdog.

"I'm very proud to be an Independent member of this Parliament and a member of the crossbench that has moved this issue from the sidelines to the

mainstream and now to legislation," she added. The Bill was amended in the Senate to add further safeguards, strengthening the power of the Inspector which oversees the NACC. "The legislation is

based largely on my model and I am proud to have played a significant role in its development through the government's consultation and as Deputy Chair of the committee which scrutinised the Bills," Dr Haines said.

"However, I am disappointed that my amendments which would have removed the exceptional circumstances clause for public hearings and further strengthened the independence and powers of the NACC, were not agreed to by the major parties but overall, this is good legislation and I wish the future NACC every success."
