Towong Council workers have launched historic industrial action over what they consider an "unfair" pay offer and rising charges for residents

For the first time in the council's history, its workers have commenced are taking protected industrial action in response to a wage proposal that workers say fails both staff and the local community.

A stop work meeting was held yesterday outside the Corryong council chambers to coincide with the monthly council meeting.

Australian Services Union (ASU) members have rejected the council's offer of 2.5 per cent or the rate cap per year.

ASU branch secretary (Vic/Tas), Tash Wark, said "This figure represents a real-world pay cut and fails to address the rising cost of living.

"Workers have been left with no other option than to take action.

"Our members have been pushed to this point by a council that refuses to offer a fair deal.

"The offer of just 2.5 per cent is a significant pay cut in real terms and shows a lack of respect members do every day to keep Towong running."

The ASU has also condemned council's

decision to increase user charges to help fund pay rises, particularly after it refused to apply for available federal government retention payments designed to help lift wages for early years childcare workers.

Ms Wark said the decision was a slap in the face to residents and workers.

"What's most alarming is that council is hitting residents with higher user charges despite the CEO herself acknowledging in a submission to the for the essential work our Fair Work Commission that residents 'cannot afford higher rates or user charges," she said.

> "This hypocrisy staggering. You can't say residents are struggling on one hand and then hike their fees with the other, all while refusing available government funding that would ease the burden.

> "It raises questions about this council's priorities."



The body of a pilot missing after his plane crashed in the Snowy Mountains near Khancoban has been located in the debris.

A rescue helicopter located the plane near Khancoban at about 4pm on Thursday after it went missing on a flight from Wangaratta to Moruya with pilot 74-year-old Bega man, David Stephens, on board.

Following an extensive search in difficult conditions, the man's body

was located just before 3pm on Friday near the crash site, approximately 500m off the Dargals Trail.

spokesperson for NSW Police said "A command post was established and a search commenced involving officers attached to the NSW Police Alpine Operations Unit with assistance from NSW and Victoria Ambulance Service, National Parks and Wildlife Service and the Joint Rescue Co-ordination Centre

airwing."

The multi-agency search resumed the following day involving officers attached to NSWS Police Rescue and Bomb Disposal Unit, State Emergency Services, the National Parks and Wildlife Service and Snowy Hydro.

An AMSA Challenger rescue jet and two helicopters from Victoria and Sydney also conducted an overhead search.

A report will be prepared for the Coroner.

Police concerned over crash numbers

Following two recent incidents including a fatality, Corryong police have issued a warning to motorists to take extra care when travelling on local roads

A man was fortunate to escape death after losing control of the 4WD vehicle he was driving on the Benambra-Corryong Road at Nariel last Wednesday.

A 41-year-old Queensland man was assisted out of wreckage by local residents and CFA, SES and ambulance services and police all attended.

The man was transported to Albury in a stable condition and treated for his injuries.

The cause of the crash is still under police investigation.

"Given this is the second sole-occupant vehicle crash in the area after the recent fatal crash in Thologolong, local police from Corryong and Walwa along with Wodonga Highway Patrol will be increasing their road presence to enforce speed and impaired driving to reinforce positive driving behaviours," said L/S Constable, Marc Gould.

Council split hopes raised

A decade long battle to demerge the Snowy Valleys Council (SVC) could finally reap rewards after the NSW Local Government Minister last week supported the splitting of the Cootamundra -Gundagai Regional Council after several council amalgamations in 2016.

SVC committed to a demerger in 2023 after the amalgamation of the Tumbarumba and Tumut Councils.

"It's pretty exciting news," said SVC mayor, Cr Julia Ham.

She said that the minister, Ron Hoenig, had indicated that SVC "was next in line" for a demerger.

It is expected that a consitutional referendum of the council's 10,000 voters asking whether they were in favour of a demerger or not will be held by October this year.

Further protected industrial action includes indefinite bans on a range of services including:-

- Street cleaning and sweeping in key areas including the main street of Tallangatta.
- Litter and garbage pickup in council reserves and roadsides.
- Emptying bins and cleaning public toilets and barbecues in the main street and foreshore areas. of Tallangatta.
- Attending internal team and department meetings.

"Taking industrial action is always a last resort but our members are united," Ms Wark said.

"We are fighting for a fair wage that allows us to live in the community we serve and we are standing against a council that is placing an unfair burden on its own residents.

"We urge council to come back to the table with a fair offer that values its workers and respects the community."

Dogs steal top spot

separating Cudgewa and Bullioh in the race for this year's premiership after the ladder leaders battled out another tight finish on Saturday with the Dogs prevailing by 14 points in the clash to unseat the Blues from top spot on the ladder, albeit by percentage only.

to fall short by 29 points against Tumbarumba.

The Demons came out firing and had the audacity to pile on five goals straight to three in the first quarter and despite the Roos waking from their slumber in the second quarter to take the lead, the Dees were still in touch at half time.

Evergreen Evan Nicholas turned back the clock in a spirited effort that yielded five goals and brother Thomas was a tireless toiler in the ruck and around the goal but the Roos steadily stretched their lead to 39 points at the last change.

However, just when it looked like they were going to run away with the game, Corryong rallied again to cap off a lively contest with a six goal to four spurt to limit the dmage.

In A Grade netball, Cudgewa cruised to a 33-goal victory over Bullioh while Corryong had a tougher encounter against Tumbarumba but eventually recorded an eight-goal win to put a gap on the Roos on the ladder to secure second spot.

However, the undefeated Cudgewa has dominated the season and is twice the number of premiership points of second-placed Corryong.


