Towong Shire Council has announced that Stage 2 of the highly anticipated \$5 million Great River Road project is well underway.

The upgrade will enhance the experience of the existing 153km-long Great River Road from Bellbridge to Khancoban to make it a premier destination for drivers, motorcyclists, cyclists, bushwalkers and campers.

It includes the delivery of walking trail projects that were identified by the council's Community Recovery Committees (CRCs) as key to assisting in the ongoing bushfire

recovery process. Other items include wayside stops and sculptures to complement the works undertaken in Stage 1.

The project is being funded with the support of the Victorian government's Bushfire Recovery Regional Economic Stimulus and Resilience Fund.

Towong mayor, Cr David Wortmann, said the council has been working closely with the CRCs to bring the projects to fruition.

"Council has been working with the them to design key elements at each site including

plant and tree species, seating and lighting styles, artwork, information board themes and more," he said.

The next step will include commissioning large-scale artwork pieces for four wayside stops and the creation of content and artwork for the information boards across all sites.

Restrictions ease again

After losing two rounds of competition because of the most recent Victorian lockdown, the Upper Murray Football Netball League (UMFNL) is planning to resume matches this weekend.

Following the easing of restrictions by the Victorian government which come into effect at 11.59pm tonight, Upper Murray club delegates convened late yesterday afternoon to decide on a course of action.

"We are waiting on official confirmation on when senior sport can

resume," UMFNL Club Support Officer, Chandan Kulkarni, told the *Courier* prior to the meeting.

"We are hoping to be able to play this weekend and contingency plans are in place for that."

The league previously decided that postponed matches would be moved to the bye rounds (June 12 and July 3) on the current draw, contingent on the return of senior sport.

If play is possible on June 12, round seven scheduled for May 29 will be played:- Tumbarumba v Corryong (at Tumba-

rumba), Federals v Cudgewa (at Corryong). Bullioh has the bye.

Round eight originally scheduled for June 5 will then be played on Saturday July 3 - Bullioh v Tumbarumba (at Bullioh), Corryong v Federals (at Corryong). Cudgewa has the bye.

In related news, the Corryong Fitness Centre will be open from tomorrow at 4am. The density limits will be capped at 10 people per open gym session or class.

Classes will resume from Monday next week.

"We want to hear from both community members and business owners in the shire," he said.

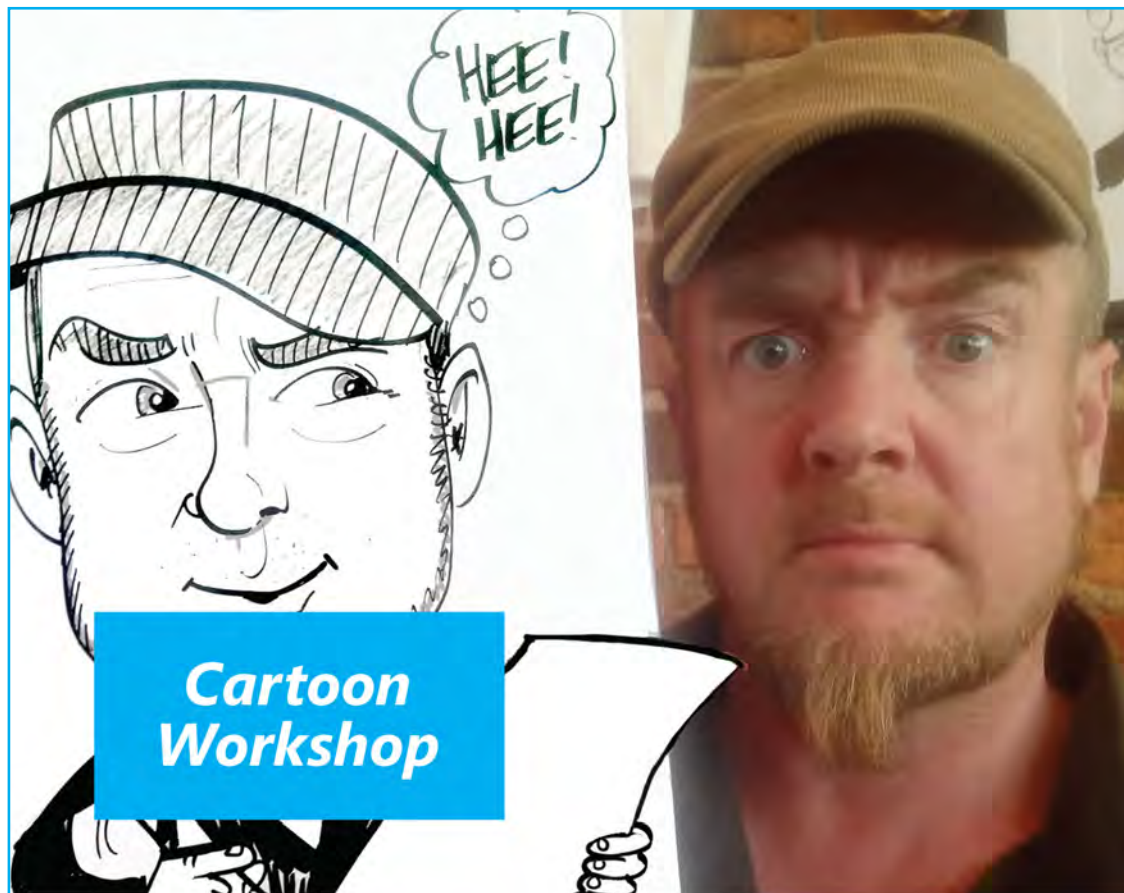

"Many of our regional clubs have been operating

at a significant loss under recent restrictions, despite being hundreds of kilometres away from the nearest case and having robust Covid-safe plans in place," Mr Lloyd said.

The Club Corryong has lost around six months of trading during the lockdowns.

Bush tracks open for weekend



Stabilising works have been carried out on local roads.

Approximately 30 kilometres of bushfire impacted roads and tracks in the Upper Murray, will re-open ahead of the Queens birthday long weekend.

Forest Fire Management Victoria (FFMVIC), Upper Murray District Manager, Dave Jensen said "Our crews and contractors have been clearing and stabilising tracks and dealing with hazardous trees to ensure the roads are safe for visitors ahead of this long weekend.

"We know that the long weekend is a busy time in the Upper Murray for campers and visitors, so it's great that we're able to make more sites available

during this period," he said.

"Following the long weekend, some roads and tracks will close as part of our seasonal road closure program and to minimise risk to the public, damage to roads and allow further hazardous tree and stabilisation works to be completed."

The following key roads are open or are planned to re-open:-

- Wheelers Creek Road between Benambra Corryong Road and Cattleman Creek Track; and

- Six Mile Ridge Track
- The following key roads remain closed:-

- Wheelers Creek Road between Buenba Road and

Mt Gibbo Track;

- Blue Gum Ridge and Tin Creek Track;

- Walkers Road between Marginal Road and Mt Pinnibar Track;

- Marginal Road between Dunstons Road and Dead Finish Track;

- Shady Creek Upper Track between Cattleman Creek Track and Dunstons Road;

- Shady Creek Lower Track; and

- Sections of the Burrowye area north of Burrowye Creek Track and Red Rooster Track.

BUSHFIRE RECOVERY BULLETIN

This bulletin provides regular updates and stories about bushfire recovery both in our local community and across Victoria's fire-affected areas.

Bushfire Recovery Victoria proudly works in partnership with council and the local community to support bushfire recovery.

LOCAL COMMUNITY PROJECT GRANTS

Upgrades to vital community assets and infrastructure, including facilities that acted as relief and recovery centres during the bushfires, funding for better tourism offerings to support the recovery of local economies like the construction of a mountain bike park, and the development of a cultural journey walk are among the new projects to share in \$14.5 million in support for local community projects across bushfire-affected areas of Victoria.

Twenty-four projects were announced on Monday 31 May 2021, under the Victorian Government's Local Community Project Grants as part of the Australian and Victorian governments' \$68.6 million Local Economic Recovery (LER) program.

Local community projects funded in Victoria's North East to support sustainable bushfire recovery include:

- \$1.5 million towards the construction of the second stage of the Mitta Valley Mountain Bike Park.
- \$850,000 for improvements to the Tawonga Community Memorial Hall.
- \$536,875 to upgrade the Harrietville Community Hall.
- \$500,000 to support the growth of a not-for-profit social enterprise that links volunteers to property owners to improve local food security via market gardens.
- \$470,000 to upgrade facilities at the Myrtleford Recreation Reserve.
- \$354,351 for the refurbishment of the Corryong and District Memorial Hall.
- \$250,921 to upgrade the facilities at the Tallangatta Memorial Hall.
- \$247,800 for the restoration of fire affected drainage lines and gullies in the Upper Murray.
- \$244,600 to replace the main green at the Corryong Bowls Club with synthetic grass.
- \$170,000 to revitalise the Cudgewa School Park.
- \$150,000 to replace the much-loved waterslide on the Ovens River in Bright.
- \$41,000 to a natural disaster recovery and climate change adaptation program to foster rural resilience in emerging leaders in the agriculture sector.

STATE BUDGET OUTCOMES

Farmers encouraged to connect



Farmers have the opportunity to share experiences with each other and learn from them.

Agriculture Victoria is encouraging Upper Murray farmers to come together in small groups to support each other through learning new skills and discussing relevant agriculture related topics.

Agriculture Recovery Manager, Kylie Macreadie, said joining one of the groups will provide farmers with a great opportunity to connect with like-minded people, share their experiences, learn from others while improving their farm business resilience - and it's free!

"Perhaps you are new to a farming family, a young farmer or have a lifetime of experience and knowledge in agriculture? Then joining a group could benefit you plus help

others.

"The groups can focus on a single topic or a range of topics over the next twelve months, meeting between four to six times throughout the year," she said.

Topics may include but are not limited to:-

- pastures;
- animal health and livestock management;
- soil health;
- farm planning
- farm business management and resilience;
- climate adaptation; and
- planning for future emergencies.

The meetings can be flexible and take place in the form of workshops, field days, formal presentations or informal discussions.

Ms Macreadie said members of the group do

not have to be directly impacted by the recent fires, just be a landholder in the shire.

"Membership is free, as Agriculture Victoria will arrange venue hire, catering and guest speakers," she added.

"An independent facilitator will be provided, and at your initial meeting you will identify the topics or themes to be covered by your group."

Dairy rules are being reviewed

The Australian government has started its review process into the Dairy Industry Code of Conduct and will be seeking input from the dairy reference group, farmers, processors and industry groups.

"The Dairy Code of Conduct was introduced on 1 January, 2020 to even out market imbalances in the dairy industry," explained Minister for Agriculture, Drought and Emergency Management, David Littleproud.

"It was a recommen-

dation of the ACCC's 2018 inquiry into the dairy industry, which found significant imbalances in bargaining power at each level of the dairy supply chain.

"This review is critical to assessing whether it is operating as intended and delivering the outcomes the dairy industry needs."

Further information on the review will be available on the Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment's website in coming weeks.

Pasture Talk

With Graham Martin (Agmate Rural Services, Corryong)

As winter comes its time to look at what needs to be done in the paddocks. We have just seen an onslaught of pests so it is time to be vigilant.

Red Legged Earth Mite are now active after frosts and rainfall and we have had a report of Rutherglen bugs...with little impact so far.

Slugs are going to have more of an impact up our way soon. They love stubble and wet areas so if you have a paddock getting chewed at the edges near trash, put a hessian sack or a bit of corrugated iron out over night and see what is



under it the next day.

As frosts increase, broadleaf weeds get tougher! Clean them up and let your pastures out compete. Every situation varies so do not think one

product fits all.

Lucerne can do with a winter clean as its growth slows dramatically. There are a few options here and some have plant-backs so whether you intend to sow into the paddock can affect what you do.

Growth promotants like gibberellic acid can be economically applied to increase winter bulk and of course, urea can be utilised if you need to create a feed wedge. The two together are a good idea as gibberellic acid uses more nitrogen to get that extra growth as it is not a fertiliser itself.

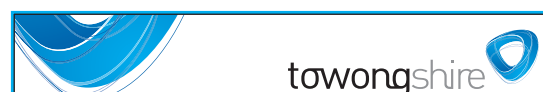

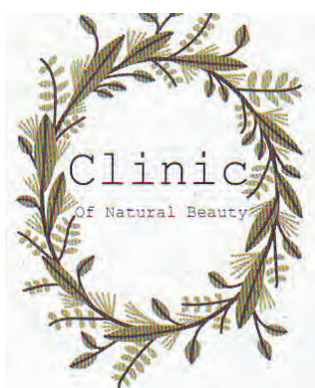

A change in the administrative arrangements for the Upper Murray Football Netball League (UMFNL), combined with the effects of the coronavirus pandemic, were the catalyst for Chandan Kulkarni arriving in Corryong to take up a new role with the league.

The league assumed responsibility for its administration from AFL NEB in November last year in a reboot after the cancellation of the 2020 season.

Nadia Edwards was subsequently appointed to the position of League Operations Officer and Mr Kulkarni is the Club Support Officer, a new role created under the AFL Bushfire Recovery Fund.

The sports management graduate had moved from India to Australia in mid-

2018 to pursue a Masters in Sports Management and he also undertook an eight-month internship at AFL Victoria HQ at Docklands while studying.

The pandemic stymied his chances of going full-time at AFL Victoria but through contacts there he was able to secure the UMFNL role, arriving in

Corryong in February.

Mr Kulkarni said he had been warmly welcomed by the clubs and the wider community.

"People are happy to have footy and netball back and we have had really good crowds on match days which is a real positive after the hiatus of last year."

New funding supports community wellbeing

The broader Upper Murray communities will benefit from a new initiative to support local football netball clubs which have been adversely affected by the impacts of the 2019-20 bushfires.

AFL North East Border (NEB) has established the Upper Murray Football Netball League (UMFNL) Community Wellness Fund to further support the clubs in their road to recovery.

"We all know how much of an adverse impact the bushfires have had on the affected communities of the Upper Murray region and also on the UMFNL clubs," said AFL Victoria Northern Manager, John O'Donohue.

"The Community Wellness Funding program will support the clubs in organising events for the broader communities of the Upper Murray and neighbouring areas which have been adversely affected by the impacts of bushfires."

Clubs can apply for funding of up to \$5000 of support to assist with costs associated with organising their club events. Successful applications will be for events or activities that encourage reconnection with the community in a social format, aiming to provoke positive interaction through free attendance.

The UMFNL has also organised two upcoming community events.

A free *Tackle Your Feelings* session will be held in Cudgewa on Thursday June 24th which is targeted at junior and senior coaches, committee members and other key individuals involved in the club.

"This would just not be another mental awareness session but an upskilling program for the targeted group," said league

support officer, Chandan Kulkarni.

"The targeted group comes in contact with the community members and mainly young people on a weekly basis and in most of the cases for them these coaches are their role models."

"Therefore, it is paramount to equip them with the required tools and mechanisms to play that important role more efficiently and responsibly."

The league is also planning a Celebrating Local Women in Leadership awards program in Corryong on 31st July.

"We have also got Towong Shire and AFL North East Border on board for this event as co-partners for which we are very thankful," Mr Kulkarni. The idea is to celebrate the achievements and contributions of the many amazing women from the Upper Murray communities.

"These same women who had to face adversities in their own personal lives due to the unfortunate calamities are also guiding and serving their respective football clubs in various capacities which is helping their clubs and the league to survive through their continued dedication and efforts."

"It promises to be a fun evening where everyone will have an opportunity to come together with their family, friends and loved ones to celebrate."

The event would consist of a leadership summit, community forum focusing on how the league could encourage gender equality and inclusion and culminate with a fun evening where the league would formally appreciate and acknowledge the vital contributions of these women.
