Parks works continue

The 2019/20 fires caused large-scale damage to much of the Upper Murray region and recovery work has been underway for months to enable safe park visitation during 2021.

Along with taking care of park facilities and infrastructure, Parks Victoria has been working with the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) to help the environment recover from bushfire impacts, supported by \$22.5 million from the Victorian government.

The extent of the impact in the Upper Murray was huge, with fire affecting 95 per cent of two local parks.

BUSHFIRE RECOVERY BULLETIN

This bulletin provides regular updates and stories about bushfire recovery both in our local community and across Victoria's fire-affected areas. Bushfire Recovery Victoria proudly works in partnership with council and the local community to support bushfire recovery.

APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN FOR LOCAL COMMUNITY PROJECT GRANTS

Grants of up to \$2 million are available, through the Local Economic Recovery program, for bushfire-affected communities to fund projects that support local economic recovery and build a sense of community pride and connectedness.

The grants are open to Community Recovery Committees and other eligible community organisations, as well as private businesses, industry groups, local councils, higher education institutions and Traditional Owner groups and Aboriginal businesses.

Organisations wanting to apply should complete the online registration of interest through the BRV website. This will connect them with BRV staff to discuss their proposal before they apply.

Practical support is available to assist volunteer community

organisations with their grant application process. This could include project scoping or even grant writing and volunteer community organisations can access that by getting in contact with BRV. This can take time, so it's important for organisations to complete their registration of interest as early as possible to make sure they get the support they need.

The LER program is just one avenue of funding available to support community recovery, our staff can provide assistance with identifying alternative funding options.

Applications for the Local Community Project grants close on 12 April 2021.



SHORT-TERM MODULAR HOUSING FAQs

Short-Term Modular Housing (STMH) is an option available for those who lost their primary place of residence in the 2019-20 Victorian Bushfires. The program is flexible and aims to get people back on their land and in their communities.

What is the design of a Short-Term Modular House? Can I choose my own design?

Standard designs come with one, two and three bedrooms, ranging from 30 to 50 square metres. The standard design of a Short-Term Modular House can be customised to meet needs such as mobility access requirements.

Susan Peterson and her parents Diane and Thomas Webb received a custom designed Short-Term Modular House in November 2020.

'It was actually one of the easiest things of all the dramas I had to deal with. I just told our case worker what I needed for Dad and that's what they came up with' - Susan Peterson, STMH recipient.

What if I can't afford Short-Term Modular Housing?

There isn't a one size fits all when it comes to paying for Short Term Modular Housing. The program is designed to be affordable.

To date, more than 60% of people who have signed up for a STMH have met eligibility for lower hire rate.

Short-Term Modular Housing will never cost more than 25% of your income.

What if my site is difficult to access?

Even if your site is difficult to access, a Short-Term Modular House is still an option.

The Sternson family of Cobungra had their Short-Term Modular House delivered in eight individual pieces, one at a time, along a 4km track. Their home was assembled on-site over twelve hours. Two cranes and three trucks were used in the process.

'It was all in the too hard basket before. The process with BRV and Windermere was seamless and easy' - Jeremy Sternson, STMH recipient.

The Short-Term Modular Housing program is open now. To get started, call 1800 560 760 to speak with a local Recovery Case Support Worker.

Parks renewal brings visitors back

The bushfires destroyed 95 per cent of the Burrowa-Pine Mountain National Park, 100 per cent of Mount Mittamatite Regional Park, four visitor sites along the Murray River Reserve and many roads and tracks within the Alpine National Park, including the iconic Mt Pinnibar area.

Since the fire, Parks Victoria has been treating hazardous trees and reconstructing and repairing tracks, fences, gates, signage and visitor facilities to ensure that visitors have a safe and enjoyable park experience once areas can be re-opened.

During 2021, Parks Victoria plans to complete recovery works within Burrowa-Pine Mountain National Park and within the remaining areas of the Alpine National Park, including Glen Dart.

"We have been able to re-open many parks and visitor sites in the Upper Murray and plan to progressively open parts of Burrowa-Pine Mountain National Park in coming months," said Ranger Team Leader, Scott Thomson.

"The impact to the Cudgewa Bluff Falls area and some other parts of Burrowa-Pine Mountain National Park has been severe.



"The loss of access infrastructure and facilities, coupled with hazardous trees, unstable slopes and the risk of rockfall, may mean that it is some time before we can safely re-open these areas.

"While this recovery work is continuing, there are many other great places to visit and things to do in areas that have been safely re-opened to visitors," he added.

All campsites along the Murray River Reserve are open as are the popular 4WD tracks within the Alpine National Park over Mt Pinnibar and Davies Plain and nearby Mount Gibbo, Mt Sassafrass and Surveyors Creek.

Mount Mittamatite Regional Park has also been re-opened with Emberys Lookout once again providing spectacular views over

Corryong.

Biodiversity recovery projects include revegetation, weed removal, large-scale animal control targeting deer, feral pigs, goats and foxes and aerial re-seeding of native Ash.

"Though the full benefits of the biodiversity programs won't be known for months, staff on the ground have reported an exciting increase in wildlife and native plant

growth, such as the re-emergence of Black Cypress Pine seedlings and other significant local flora," Mr Thomson said.

"The Upper Murray region is a picturesque area offering both alpine mountainous terrain and absolute tranquillity along the Murray River."

"We believe this a game changer for the region that will encourage sustainability and tourism growth and we wish the Pickled Parrot Providore owners all the very best for a successful enterprise."

The vacant store space

was identified as a priority issue by the Khancoban community resulting in SVC purchasing the building in 2018 and undertaking shop front refurbishments with \$199,000 in funding secured from the NSW government's Major Projects Infrastructure fund.

The Pickled Parrot Providore is a general store and café featuring locally sourced fruit and vegetables and locally produced gourmet products as well as all the grocery essentials and locally roasted coffee.

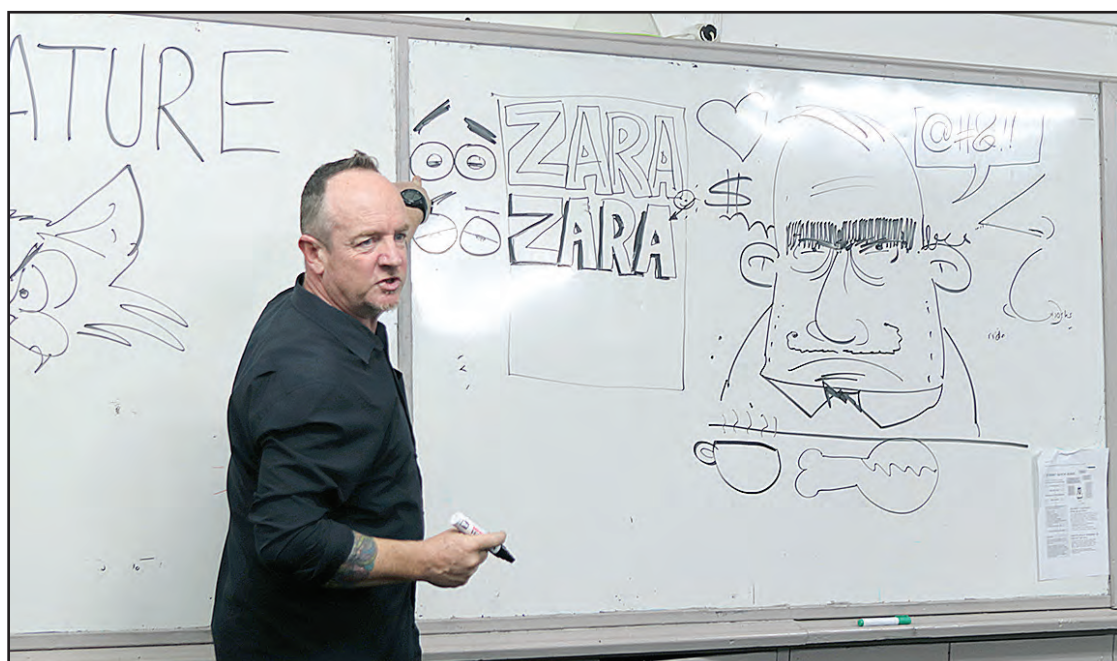
Power of art helps the healing process

It's been more than a year since bushfires devastated the Upper Murray, leaving an aftermath of personal hardship and adversity.

The long term mental health effects are prevalent for all, particularly among primary and secondary students who are vulnerable to traumatic events.

That's why local organisations, health services, schools and artists are working together to support the Corryong community through a community-based arts project titled 'My Home, My Place'.

The initiative is being facilitated by a group of health and education professionals from Corryong Health, Albury Wodonga Health, Gateway Health, Creative Recovery Network, Towong Shire, Bushfire Recovery Victoria, Regional Arts Victoria, Catholic Education Sandhurst, NSW Department of Education, Corryong Neighbourhood House, Beyond Blue's Bushfire Response Program and The Royal Children's Hospital's Festival of Healthy Living.



Cartoonist, Adrian Osborne, was one of the artists to visit local schools.

Over the course of four days, four local primary and high schools participated in a range of creative workshops facilitated by local artists from the Corryong, Walwa, Cudgewa, Albury and Wodonga areas.

Workshops included visual arts, cartooning, drama, circus, drumming and rhythm, script writing, sound scaping, cartooning and shadow puppetry.

"The power of art to help process trauma and

achieve healing should not be underestimated," explained John Lane, Artistic Director of The Royal Children's Hospital Festival of Healthy Living.

"Some art forms enable individuals to deal directly with emotional issues, whereas others allow the development of persistence and positive self-talk. The activities explore mental health issues in creative, solution focused and interesting ways."

Along with providing an opportunity for children to express their emotions through a range of meaningful art forms, feedback will be used to inform future recovery planning and ascertain the community's interest in adopting similar arts-based recovery strategies.

"Bushfire recovery for children is incredibly important, however we often find that they are overlooked because they don't have a big voice in

recovery," said Corryong Health's Director of Community Services, Vicki Pitcher.

"Giving children tools to understand and cope with their emotional responses is one of the most important aspects of recovery and healing. Undertaking this important work while fostering meaningful arts, health and education partnerships makes this project particularly special," she said.

Fencers unite with kids in recovery task

A year on from the 2019-20 bushfires, many Upper Murray properties still need fencing repairs and Uniting Church

volunteer crews are in for the long haul.

Despite the coronavirus restrictions, the teams have been able to help many farmers throughout the district and last week they had some additional manpower when Year 11 students from St Joseph's College in Geelong arrived.

The 18 students were formed into three groups under the guidance of Uniting Church volunteers and spent two days fencing at several local properties.

The students elected to help with the fencing

Obituary:- Brian Albert Whiteley- 10/09/1932- 17/02/2021 *Innovative breeder could turn his hand to anything*

Brian was born in Tasmania at the La Trobe Hospital on 10 September, 1932. His father Albert and mother Myra farmed nearby at Sprent. He was the oldest of four children, the others being twin sisters Betty and Nancy and his brother Rex.

In 1944 the family moved to Victoria where they settled near Pakenham at a property called 'Hillside'.

Brian left school in 1946, aged 14. At that time he started breeding and showing his own stud sheep - initially Ryeland and Southdown, then Poll Dorset. He was a very successful breeder and became a judge at sheep shows at an early age. He bought a property adjacent to his parent's farm and built up an agricultural contracting business.

He also became a youth group leader and Sunday School teacher at the Pakenham Methodist Church.

He married Alison in June 1959.

In October 1963 Brian and Alison bought the property 'Piarri' at Cudgewa North and moved there with Stephen, who was born in 1962. Brian's Poll Dorset stud 'Merndale' was established in 1964. In the early days, he crutched and sheared the sheep himself. His rams were sought after for being well bred and of good quality. As well as the ram stud, Brian also ran hereford cattle in the early days.

Brian continued to be a harvesting contractor in the Pakenham area after moving to Cudgewa

North. During the first five years, after the harvest was finished in the Upper Murray, Brian returned to Pakenham for around six weeks from December to mid-January. His Bedford truck was loaded up with the tractor, mower and rake, with the baler towed behind. If it rained at Christmas time, he would come home for a couple of days. Otherwise, he just kept going to get the job done. In the meantime, Alison stayed on the farm and looked after the sheep and cattle.

When he and Alison came to Cudgewa North, it was to improve their farm. The home block had a neat two bedroom house made of rammed earth and a rundown dairy and yards. Most of the farm was not developed.

Brian set about clearing the land, sowing pasture, fencing and building dams. This was a major project over many years. He could turn his hand to most things and planned and built a new bedroom on the end of the house when Robert was born in 1968. He also built hay sheds, the shearing shed, machinery sheds and stock yards. He could dig a post hole with a shovel and crowbar and cut redgum fence posts using a chainsaw.

As Steve, Robert and Phillip, who was born in 1971, grew they became a team, working with Brian at every opportunity on fencing, harvesting and stockwork.

Brian was an innovative farmer. He researched new technology and implemented it when he



had the opportunity. He was also a very good record keeper with diaries going back to when he purchased the property recording the daily activities. He always worked with purpose each day was planned, often in the early mornings.

Brian was an active community member. He was a Sunday school teacher at the Cudgewa Methodist Church and deacon and elder of the Corryong Baptist Church, where he served faithfully for many years and developed lifelong friendships. He was also on the Corryong High School Council and the Upper Murray Football League Tribunal.

In May 2003, following devastating wild dog attacks that killed and maimed a large number of young rams, Brian dispersed his sheep stud. This was in the midst of a prolonged drought. After this time, he primarily farmed Angus cattle and continued his contract

harvesting.

In his later years, once he had retired, Brian continued to take an interest in Robert and Phillip's properties. He also spent many Saturdays watching his grandsons playing football for Cudgewa.

Brian passed away peacefully at Corryong Hospital on February 17. He is survived by his wife of 62½ years, Alison, sons and daughters-in-law Steve and Alison, Robert and Trish, Phil and Sarah and grandchildren Thomas, Campbell, Laura, Isabelle, Harriet, Lachlan, Prudence, James, Albert and Montgomery, as well as his brother Rex and sister Nancy.

Brian's legacy is in his family, the values he shared with them and the love he gave them. Together with Alison, he was very proud of his sons and his grandchildren and he was dearly loved by his three daughters-in-law. He will be sadly missed.

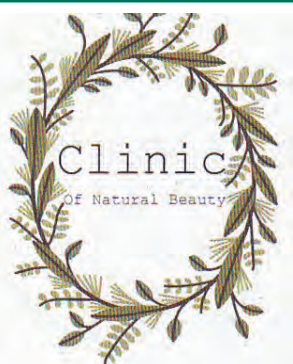

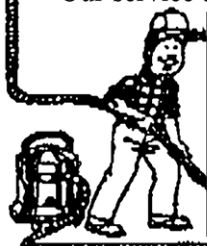

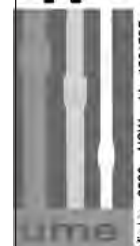
