'We'll dump tax hike'

The Liberals and Nationals will scrap Labor's Emergency Services Property Levy (ESVF), Member for Benambra, Bill Tilley, vowed at a rally on the steps of Parliament House on Tuesday (pictured).

"This is a tax that rips \$765 million a year from Victorian families, farmers and small businesses under



the guise of supporting a emergency services," Mr of Tilley said.

"Labor's new levy has doubled or even tripled charges for property owners across the state with primary producers hit hardest and facing rate hikes of up to 150 per cent. "Under Labor's

"Under Labor's changes, a typical home valued at \$1 million now attracts a \$309 annual charge, while small businesses and farmers are paying thousands more without any guarantee that money will go to frontline services."

The Victorian Farmers Federation (VFF) says under the changes, the median fire services levy for primary producers will jump from \$621 to \$1,299 per assessment, representing a staggering 109 per cent increase, resulting in some landholders receiving

Snowy workers strike over pay parity

1000 More than Workers' Australian Union (AWU) members Australia's largest at renewable energy project were slated to walk off the job for 24 hours yesterday after their employer, Italian company Webuild, refused to offer them pay parity with their tunnelling colleagues in Melbourne.

Webuild is undertaking tunnelling work on the North East Link project in Melbourne and pays their workers on that site significantly more than workers employed on Snowy 2.0.

Snowy 2.0 workers have had enough said AWU NSW Secretary, Tony Callinan.

"Webuild wasted the first 10 weeks of negotiations by refusing to engage," he said. "They didn't respond

at all to the log of claims the AWU put to them on behalf of our 1000 odd members in mid-January. "Our members have had enough of the games and that's why we intended to take 24 hours of protected industrial action on Wednesday.

"All our members want is to be paid the same money for the same work as those working for the same company in Melbourne.

"Those working on Snowy 2.0 live and work in the wilderness of the Snowy Mountains in the middle of winter and when they're not underground tunnelling they'rwork camps.

"They work 14-day

members working in the Snowy Mountains would expect to be paid the same as workers in Melbourne who go home to their families each night."

State budget insults regional communities

The Victorian government has sacrificed regional and rural communities on the altar of budget repair, according to Rural Councils Victoria (RCV).

"The budget is propped up by hundreds of millions of dollars that will be ripped from the state's rural communities through the unfair Emergency Services Volunteers Fund levy," RCV chair, Rob Amos said.

"Despite using rural communities to prop up the state's finances, this budget fails to deliver for rural communities. Most of the spending is preannounced or business as usual, with very few new initiatives for rural voters.

"Investing in new schools and roads upgrades is the bare minimum we expect from government," Cr Amos said.

"Rural Victoria is bearing the brunt of tax increases with very little to show for it.

"The budget appears not to contain any new measures to support rural councils to manage the delivery essential programs and basic infrastructure with limited revenue."

\$3.5 million will be used for cutting red tape across regional areas including digitising regional council systems; and \$400,000 has been set-aside for the creation of Regional Launching Pads' to help stimulate regional businesses. There is also \$88 million for regional housing, as part of the Commonwealth's Housing Support Program.

"Only Labor could try and spin a massive land tax as support for volunteers," Mr Battin said.

"This is not about emergency services, it's about squeezing more cash from Victorians to pay for Labor's budget blowouts."

The VFF has added its voice to the outrage, saying it is deeply disappointed by the outcome and remains gravely concerned about the impact this levy will have on farmers, who are already under significant pressure from drought conditions and broader economic challenges. "While the government has announced a 16 per cent reduction in the levy for farmers and a temporary pause for those in drought-declared areas, these concessions do little to ease the broader burden that will be felt across rural Victoria," said VFF president, Brett Hosking.

"The sheer reality is that this levy will create a crippling financial burden to farmers.

"This decision shows a clear disconnect between our state government and the day-to-day realities faced by those on the land."

Rural areas pay the price

At long last the Victorian government is being called out for what it is - rapacious, irresponsibly spendthrift, leaning, left union dominated, urban centric and doing too little too late to help farmers who are simply doing their best to play their part in feeding the nation. The new Emergency

Services and Volunteers Levy is just a damned disgrace. It will cost us many times more than the previous levy and will contribute to a decline in mental health for many and this at the same time as we're trying to cope with the drought.

The Premier has said that CFA volunteers and drought affected farmers will be exempted but only after we have paid the levy. The government knows full well who its CFA volunteers are (from CFA HQ) and also its farmers (from their licence to operate as a farm).

We should not be paying the levy in the first place and how long will the

promised refund take - if it ever happens? The levy will force many farmers either to sell stock, delay infrastructure maintenance and improvements, lay off casual workers and reduce feeding out to their animals.

Premiers Andrews and Allen have spent irresponsibly and are now asking Victorians, particularly those of us who live in rural and regional communities, to bail them out.

Local councils are being put in the invidious position of having by law to collect the new levy while knowing the effect it will have on those communities.

I sincerely hope there will be a campaign of mass civil disobedience as there seems no other way to instil a sense of fairness and justice in the Victorian government

We breed and raise Aberdeen Angus cattle on 1175 acres at Towong. Just to get through the next three to four months we need to spend just over \$100,000 to keep our cattle alive (grouper, auger, hay, straw and grain). We've now bought in two loads of square hay bales, one of straw and secured a third of hay and fodder prices keep increasing weekly. Supplementary feed of 28 tonnes of grain will last six weeks.

Victorian The government has done too little too late to alleviate the situation. While the \$5,000 drought relief grant is welcome it's really nothing more than a drip in the ocean.

Meanwhile, we have to sit and watch our neighbours across the river in NSW burning off while the fire danger period here is likely to be extended until late June.

All this against the background of new or relatively taxes like Vacant Property Tax and Land Tax! Where does it end? Mark Auchinleck, Towong.

Mountains group celebrates milestone



The re-opening of the Bluff Falls tourist area on Sunday after restoration works is a huge feather in the cap for the 'Friends of Murray Mountain Parks' group, which is celebrating 25 years of volunteerism.

The occasion was marked in December when Parks Victoria Ranger, Scott Thompson, presented several members with a 25 Years Recognition of Service pin and a cake adorned with gum nuts and leaves was duly served with a cup of billy tea. humble From

beginnings, the 'Friends of Mount Lawson State Park' was incorporporated in September 1999.

Working alongside the local Parks Victoria staff, the group's early volunteering efforts and application for grant funding saw the installation of the information board and trestle bridge viewing platform at the entrance to the park and the production of a bushwalkers guide widely available through information outlets.

In November 2013, at a special general meeting it was decided to change thei name to 'Friends of Murray Mountain Parks' to more accurately reflect the extent of Parks Victoria's responsibilities in the North East. It was hoped to attract the interest of like minded people living nearby that now included areas of The Kurrajongs, Burrowve Reserve. Burrowa Pine Mountain and Mount Mittamitite.

Coming together every few months, many working bees have taken place in the endeavour to develop and enhance the visitor experience of these unique local natural assets.

Clearing and maintaining walking tracks, camping sites and picnic settings is an ongoing activity; with successful and funding applications and group initiatives many achievements have been

realised. New

walking tracks, picnic settings, information boards and signposts have been installed. Other works included removal of invasive plants, native tree planting, landscaping for erosion control and rehabilitation projects at sites depleted by natural causes - particularly the Black Summer bushfires of early 2020 and by human usage.

However, the group's activities are not always about effort. Many field trips to historic sites and locations of special interest and spectacular views have taken place.

Members have also regularly taken part in the area's many flora and fauna surveys, often informed by leading experts in their field. Several 'torch light'

walks have been held and members also meet for the rare 'purely social' occasion.

The name of the group says it all. Many lasting friendships have been forged across the years. There is always a barbecue on the go with a good spread of tucker at hand along with a cup or two of billy tea; and it is always a joy when families come along - children and young adults always adding something special to the day.

It is the group's hope that through supporting Parks Victoria's official re-opening of Bluff Falls, more people will see the enjoyment of getting outdoors and involved in the process of creating and maintaining a healthy and user-friendly parks? experience.

Small towns get more support

Upper Murray Sport Blues remain undefeated

After the completion of three rounds of local football, it appears that the premiership race is already down to two teams - Cudgewa and Bullioh which have contested the previous two grand finals for one flag apiece.

The Blues remain undefeated after despatching Tumbarumba by 132 points in clinical fashion on Saturday.

Cudgewa flew the blocks and established a four-goal lead at quarter time which it extended at each break before putting an exclamation point on the peformance with a seven-goal final term.

Blues' spearhead John Spencer continued his early sharpshooting form with 10 goals to lead the league list with 36 majors an average of 12 per game, putting him well on track to reach the century by season's end. Dangerous forward Ben Hall also played a superb support role with seven majors.

The Roos struggled to retain possession even when they did get the Sherrin as the Blues onball brigade in Dylan Haycraft, Jake Vinge, Mitch Pynappels and Jake Hill ran riot to force turnovers and provide a steady supply of ball to their forwards who capitalised in spades.

Cudgewa is also undefeated in A Grade netball after comfortably defeating second-ranked Tumbarumba by 27 goals, firming as favourites for another premiership.
