Park project gets the skates on

Towong Shire Council has announced that Haley Constructions has started work on the new Corryong skatepark.

Council successfully secured \$882,000 in funding from the National Recovery and Resilience Agency's Black Summer Bushfire Recovery Grants Program in 2022 for the project.

After conducting a community survey in 2022 and 2023, it was determined that the new

skate park would not be built at the existing location on Strezelecki Way and would instead be built at the old Corryong Primary School site, situated on the corner of Anzac Avenue and Towong Road.

The facility will feature enhanced park elements with the goal of promoting recreational engagement and fostering social connections, particularly the Upper Murray.

In other council news, work on Stage 2 of the CBD upgrade in Corryong re-commenced last week, with contractors focusing on drainage works. The installation of electrical

conduits and replacement verandah posts is also underway this week.

Testing of the new watermain has also commenced, with changeover from old new infrastructure

expected to be completed within a couple of weeks.

North East Water is responsible for this work and will manage communications affected business and property owners.



Lankeys Creek volunteer brigade member, John Hawkins, claims that on May 17th he had been told by his RFS manager that his Group vehicle - a 2005 Toyota Landcruiser with 600lts of water (classed as a Cat 9) - was to be taken off him, with no replacement available.

Mr Hawkins said that the vehicle has 11 plus years of serviceable life left but is to be sold, even though the Southern Border area has older appliances (tankers) in its fleet.

"I was told I could use the Lankeys Creek Cat 9 which is its brigade vehicle, for the use of the Brigade Captain or my Deputy," Mr Hawkins

"Otherwise, I could use my own private vehicle, which I did for a number of years prior to having a

"However, I don't see why I should with the size of the area I look

The Group 7 region comprises the brigades of Jingellic, Lankeys Creek, Little Billabong, Carabost, Talmalmo, Mt Wagra and Wantagong and includes 95 per cent of the Woomargama National Park.

Mr Hawkins added that he used his Group vehicle to attend brigade meetings as well as active fires and mopping up exercises and that he occasionally took it to work on bad

"My having a Cat 9 has been a bone of contention for many years," he said.

New barber hunts the good life

While the fishing and hunting opportunities in the region have brought Stuart Gallus to Corryong, his profession as a master barber has also filled a niche on the local business front.

After operating a barbershop in Broome for the past 25 years, the former Beechworth resident packed up his belongings and headed east to spend more time pursuing his interests and Corryong has fit the bill.

"I built the business up in Broome to where I had 12 staff but it was time for a change." Stuart said.

"I like to think I'm semi-retired but I still need to pay the bills though, which is why I opened The Corryong Barber Shop."

Modelled on the traditional 'gentleman's barber shop' complete with chair, Stuart offers

"The paid staff claim they don't want Group Captains to have a vehicle that carries water, even though my job as an RFS volunteer is to put fires out!" Mr Hawkins said.

"The Cat 9 is quick response and best suited to the hills where I am a Group Captain."

In his resignation letter, Mr Hawkins also took the RFS to task over a number of other issues.

He alleged that there is a lack of communication between RFS management and brigades.

"The high turnover of staff means volunteers are continually having to deal with people that don't know my area; and to be questioned as to whether I really need the resources that I have requested, having to justify that the fire is in inaccessible country and yes, I do need a bulldozer and air support with water!" he said.

Mr Hawkins cited the Green Valley blaze during the Black Summer 2019-20 bushfires as a prime example of the lack of communication between agencies.

"I attend cross-border meetings between NSW RFS, Victorian CFA, National Parks, State Forests, DEECA etc but when we get a major fire like Green Valley, on the border, those agencies won't talk to and work with each other to put it out," he said.

"For instance, when offered help from Victoria to water bomb the Green Valley fire on the very first day, RFS in Albury knocked it back," he alleged.

Mr Hawkins also said brigade members with firefighting experience were not considered qualified to man a tanker because they have not completed online training; even though he is prepared to sign them off as being competent.

Mr Hawkins added that he was not asked to give his account at the inquest into the Black Summer fires, even though the fire was his jurisdiction. "The main issue to come out of the coronial inquest into the fires that ravaged NSW in 2019/2020 was the lack of communication by the RFS, ignoring local knowledge and therefore hindering volunteer efforts to fight the fires," he said.

"Four years on from the Black Summer fires, nothing has changed between the RFS and the volunteers.

"We have more paid staff, more red tape, less communication and less volunteers to do the actual work

"The RFS is not prepared to support volunteers for what they need in the event of fires, support that should include Group Captains having an appropriate vehicle."

Mr Hawkins letter concluded "After putting up with more than 20 years of crap from bureaucrats that should be working for me and fighting with them to keep a vehicle that they have made their mission to take off me - I quit!"



Ally Boers, Brie Jones, Rochelle Sandilands, Sandra Green, Charlie O'Connor, Lisa Wilkinson and Helen Marshall raised nearly 10 per cent of the proceeds raised by the entire challenge bringing in a total of \$7554(challenge total \$77,762).

They also walked a combined total of 11.000kms enjoying many sunrises, sunsets and beautiful views across the Upper Murray. Lisa Wilkinson joined in all the way over in Tasmania, having moved away but wanting to support her friends.

The seven women joined together as a show of support for Ally, husband whose Clint was diagnosed with a glioblastoma, an aggressive and quick growing type of brain tumour, last year. He has since been undergoing treatment

With three young boys, the impact of this disease on their family and loved ones is huge.

The charity walk was



something the group of friends could do together to try to make a difference, both for Ally's family and the other members of the community also impacted by brain cancer.

As brain cancer research is poorly funded, receiving only five per cent of federal cancer research funding, despite it being the biggest killer of people under 40 including children. Sadly, survival rates have not improved over the past three decades.

The money raised by Ally and her friends is vitally important, not just for Ally and her family but for all of those impacted by brain cancer.

The group plans to organise more events in the future to continue to raise money to fund research into brain cancer and treatment.







Corryong Heavy Vehicle Bypass

Project Completed

Work on the Corryong Heavy Vehicle Bypass along the Stock Route has wrapped up, with the project now completed. Here's what has been delivered: Realignment of the Briggs Gap Road/Stock Route Intersection and two main corners along the Stock Route, New drainage and culverts along Stock Route, Pavement reconstruction works, Sealing and linemarking of approximately 3 kms of road. This upgrade to the Stock Route has brought significant improvements to accommodate Heavy Vehicles providing a safer alternative route for trucks and addressing safety concerns associated with using the main street. This project was generously funded by the Australian Government through the Heavy Vehicle Safety and


