

New event funded

Locals and visitors will be welcomed to Khancoban this spring with a Long Lunch Event thanks to a successful grant application by Snowy Valleys Counci (SVC).

It has received \$27,000 in funding under the Commonwealth government's Regional Tourism Bushfire Recovery Grants to host the lunch event.

Executive Director
Community and
Corporate, Paul Holton,
said hosting a Long Lunch
event would encourage
visitors to Khancoban
during spring and help
to showcase the town's
beauty, unique location,
and the beautiful regional
produce on offer.

"We are very pleased to have been successful with this grant application that will enable us to showcase Khancoban during its best season and bring increased visitation to the town," said Mr Holton.

Khancoban has seen some exciting projects come to fruition over the

past 12 months including the opening of the Pickled Parrot Providore bringing the General Store building back to life.

Mr Holton said increased tourism marketing, collaboration with National Parks & Wildlife Services and with Snowy Hydro has been a focus of council's Place Activation team in Khancoban following the bushfires and Covid border closures.

"The recent successful Snowy Hydro Family Fun Day, our NSW Women's Week High Tea and the ongoing beautification of the town's centre and surrounds has generated increased visitation and community engagement," Mr Holton said.

Council also received \$390,000 in funding from the first round of event funding through the Regional Tourism Bushfire Recovery Grant Program to host three events in Batlow, Tumbarumba and Adelong this year under the Winter Bites banner.

Motorists are advised of changed traffic conditions this month on Alpine Way, near Khancoban, for essential repairs.

Work is being carried out to repair two slopes, 6.5 kilometres south of Khancoban on the Alpine Way, to provide motorists with a safer road.

Repairs are being carried out on a one-kilometre section from 8am to 5pm on weekdays and from 8am to 1pm on Saturdays, until the end of June, weather permitting.

Single lane closures, traffic control and reduced speed limits of 40 km/h will be in place for the safety of workers and motorists during the project.

Outside of work hours traffic lights will be in place to guide motorists through lane closures in the work zone.

Local students can name tunnel borer



Snowy Hydro is calling on all year 5-12 school students in the Snowy Mountains area to join in the competition to name two new tunnel boring machines (TBMs).

Before the imposing machines start digging the Snowy 2.0 tunnels, they need to have names and students in the Snowy Monaro and Snowy Valleys council areas and Corryong district are being asked to come up with their best science, technology, engineering

and mathematics (STEM) related suggestions as part of the TBM Naming Competition.

There are two TBMs to be named, with the first Snowy 2.0 machine already titled the Lady Eileen Hudson, in honour of the original Snowy Scheme ambassador and wife of inaugural Commissioner, Sir William Hudson.

TBMs are always given female names, a tradition stemming from the 1600s when miners working underground prayed to Saint Barbara for protection.

To be a part of the 2.0 Tunnel Snowy Boring Machine Naming Competition, students should nominate a groundbreaking or inspiring Australian woman in STEM and explain their choice in 200 words or less. The students whose shortlisted names gain the most public votes are the winners.

Snowy Hydro managing director and

CEO, Paul Broad, said the competition was a fun way to spark children's interest in STEM fields.

"We see our local kids as the future - the next generation of engineers, scientists and innovators at Snowy Hydro," Mr Broad said.

"Snowy 2.0 is a nationally-important infrastructure and engineering project right here in the Snowy Mountains, so the chance to name one of our massive, 11-metre tunnel

boring machines is an exciting opportunity."

To enter the competition, local students in years 5-12 should complete the entry form on the snowyhydro.com. au website by 11.59pm Sunday 23 May, 2021.

The two most popular names, as voted by the public, will be used to identify the TBMs and the students who nominated them will receive a visit to the Snowy 2.0 construction site to see a TBM before it goes underground.

Snowy puts safety first



Snowy Hydro and Driving Solutions have united to once again present the 2021 Young Driver Program with hundreds of students from seven local schools participating.

The Snowy Hydro Young Driver Program, which kicked off in Corryong this week, is a hands-on approach to driver training specifically designed to prepare Learner and Provisional drivers in the Snowy Mountains for the driving conditions they face on the region's roads.

"The program has been running for 20 years and continues to demonstrate our commitment to the safety and well-being of young people living in the Snowy Mountains," said Snowy Hydro CEO, Paul Broad.

Under the guidance professional and experienced instructors from Driving Solutions, students drive current vehicles while participating in exercises that teach emergency braking, control understeer and oversteer, and allow students to feel the effects of vehicle safety features such as ABS and stability control.

They experience stopping on low-friction surfaces and learn techniques to improve their steering and vision.

Students are also taught about driving conditions unique to the Snowy Mountains such as snow, ice and wildlife, as well as the dangers of driving under the influence of drugs and alcohol.

Since its inception in 2002, the Snowy Hydro Young Driver Program has provided more than 1,400 local students with the opportunity to improve their driving skills and become safer drivers.

After running a reduced

After running a reduced program due to Covid-19 in 2020, the 2021 program is fully booked, with close to 250 students planning to attend.

"Snowy Hydro isproud to support and invest in initiatives which made a positive impact among the local community," Mr Broad said.

"We've been a part of this region for decades and we are committed to supporting youth, education for locals and the highest safety principles. This is reflected in the value we place in the annual Young Driver Program."

This year the Snowy Hydro Young Driver Program coincides with National Road Safety Week (May 16-23), which it is hoped will further emphasise the importance of road safety in regional communities including the Snowy Mountains.

"With this year's program being held in the lead up to, and during National Road Safety Week, we aim to bring to life those important messages around road safety and raise more awareness about the risks that regional communities like the Snowy Mountains face when driving on the roads," said James Stewart, Director of

Driving Solutions.

"Young Drivers in rural areas face unique driving conditions compared to their city counterparts, so it's very important that these young people have the opportunity to learn valuable driving skills in a safe and controlled environment, before potentially having to test out their ability for the first time in a real life emergency scenario.

"The Snowy Hydro Young Driver program helps students gain the skills they need to stay safe on the road, and we know that the training we deliver makes a positive difference to their attitude and behaviour behind the wheel." said Mr Stewart.

Snowy Hydro will be holding a community drop-in session at its Discovery Centre in Cooma this Saturday 8 May for Year 12 students considering a traineeship, their families and prospective apprentices.

The session, which runs from 9am to 11am, complements the school presentations conducted throughout the Snowy Mountains region and provides additional opportunities for the community to learn more about Snowy Hydro's annual apprentice and trainee intake.

Foodie gets back to his roots



It started with the promise of super cheap chicken wings and turned into a nation-wide search for the most impressive culinary feats regional Australia has to offer.

Food lover Alo Baker, who spent his early years at Tooma, has eaten his around regional areas across the country and is now sharing his discoveries in the new series The Food Dude, which is now airing on 7mate.

Dubbo-based Triple M radio announcer said the idea for the series came a few years ago when he got a tip about a small eatery on the Gold Coast selling chicken wings for 15 cents a pop.

"I was so impressed by what they'd put in front of me that I filmed a few clips on my iPhone and posted it on social media," Baker told news.com.au.

"Within minutes it had thousands of views and I realised, hey – people love food!" he said, joking "I hadn't realised that's what 90 per cent of Instagram was at the time.'

After catapulting the 15c wings into instant popularity – the eatery struggled to keep up with demand – Baker turned his attention to another local restaurant specialising in American-style burgers and shared that on social media as well, quickly realising much how Australians craved ideas

and advice on the best places to eat.

"Before I knew it I was punching out videos on social media getting hundreds of thousands of views across South East Queensland," he said.

Around this time Baker was working on another series called Aussie Dreamlivers, in which he and a couple of mates embarked on a wild adventure through North American the wilderness.

When he got back to Australia, he got to work on the idea of an Australian food series that would showcase regional success stories and all the incredible culinary wonders in lesser known parts of the country.

Filming challenging due to Covid-19 and travel restrictions meant many of the first places he visited were in NSW and Queensland, though he's managed to venture further out since.

And he's made some incredible food discoveries along the way.

"I discovered Shannon Nolls' favourite pie from his local childhood pastry tastery the Condo Bakery in Condobolin in western NSW - which is also haunted," Baker said.

"I also discovered, after indulging too much on chocolate fudge and ice-cream, you shouldn't go on a dolphin cruise in

Jervis Bay - especially if you are prone to sea sickness!

"I found a twometre pizza at Criniti's in Newcastle, a huge Tomahawk steak in Junee and judged pies at Quinneys Pies on the Gold Coast, among a stack of other things.'

Some of the most memorable moments for Baker came during a visit to the Upper Murray where he saw how regional areas have struggled over 2020.

"The region was smashed by the bushfires and then again by Covid,"

"I actually came home to help with the fires at the time and those local businesses got hit hard so being able to show off what they're capable of was a real privilege for

"But the general vibe from businesses affected by the fires and then Covid - from the Snowy Valleys to the NSW south coast is that despite everything, they want people to know they're still there and pushing out the best of the best in food offerings.

Baker filmed a segment at Macca's Takeaway in Corryong, reminiscing on eating there growing up but encouraging people to come to town for tourism after the fires

"These businesses are powering forward, kicking goals and making world class food that deserves its

place in the spotlight," he

"From a pie shop in Rutherglen, Victoria to a Mexican food van in Townsville, these places are the local heroes in our regional towns and that is why The Food Dude exists.

During his regional travels Baker tested his nerve with some epic food challenges, often with hilarious results.

He encounters some truly monstrous meals, such a 2.5kg chicken parmigiana, platter-sized Tomahawk steak, twometre pizzas, 3kg burgers and "massive shank challenges the size of a family roast".

With Australians taking regional holidays as much as ever right now, and with quality food to experience almost everywhere, Baker's advice for travellers was to simply "pull a map out and randomly pick a spot."

"Even the bakeries are changing with the times and are offering gourmet items you'd never realise were made in the old faithful pastry shop," he said. Small business is fighting back and pushing out stuff you won't see anywhere else."





Blues run riot in 41-goal rout



Cudgewa went on a scoring rampage against a severely depleted Federal's side on Saturday, with the mammoth 251-point victory signifying that the Blues will be the yardstick for the competition.

The Swans were held scoreless for three quarters in the one-sided contest and most interest centred on the number of goals Blues' spearhead Kylin could amass, starting with six in the first term and a total of 20 majors for the match.

The question was raised as to whether this was an individual record but big bags of goals were regularly scored against Tumbarumba in its early days in the league in the 1970s, with Cudgewa players Merv Ward and John Chitty booting more than 20 majors against the Roos on two occasions.
