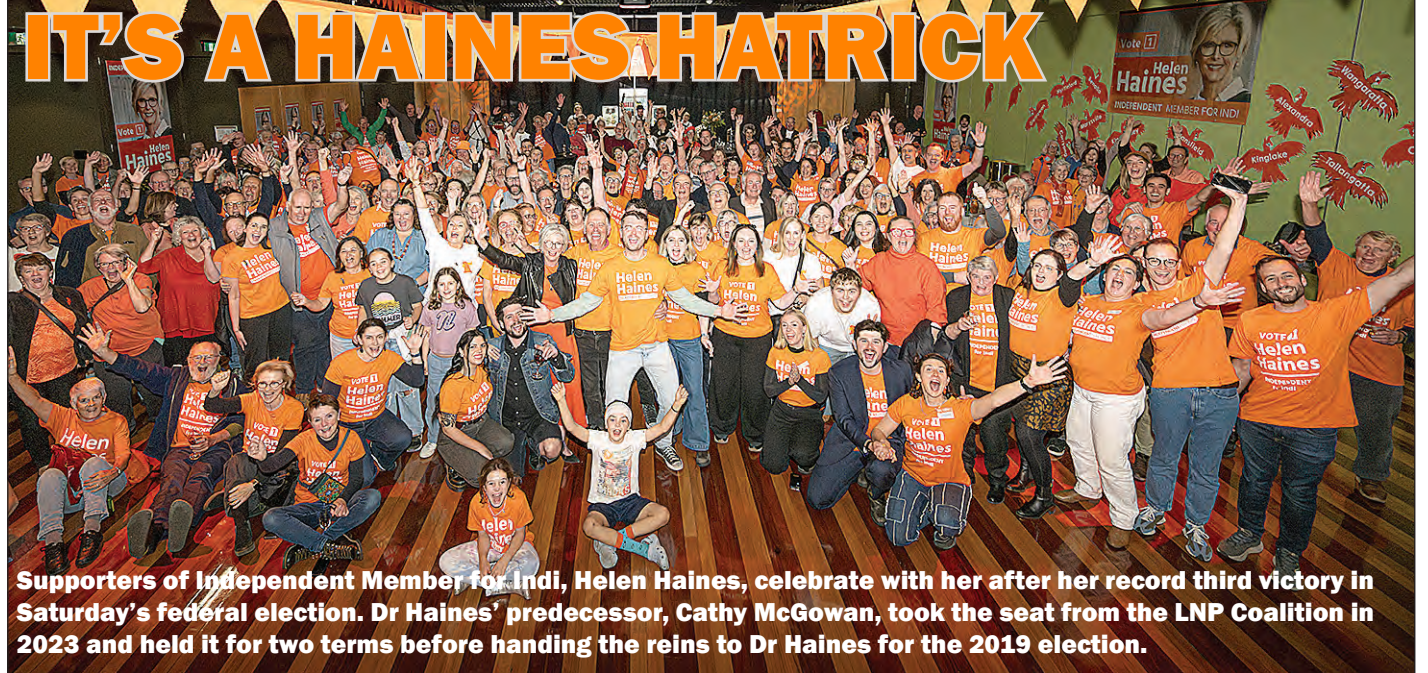

## Trust launches future proofing fund

Border Trust has launched its most ambitious initiative yet - a \$20million Community Impact Fund (CIF) - as part of its 20th anniversary celebrations and the commencement of Local Giving Month.

The launch event took place last Thursday at the Hume Boat Club at Bellbridge, overlooking Lake Hume; symbolising the collective power of building something lasting drop by drop.

Established in 2005, Border Trust has spent two decades working with

generous local donors to distribute more than \$5 million in grants to charities and not-for-profits across Albury, Wodonga, Towong, Indigo, Federation and Greater Hume. These grants have helped address everything from social isolation and youth mental health to natural disaster recovery and community leadership.

Now, Border Trust is looking to the future.

"When we first established Border Trust, our goal was to create something truly local and

lasting," says original Board Director, Chris Horton.

"To see the Community Impact Fund being launched 20 years later - something that will benefit our region for generations - is both humbling and inspiring."

The Community Impact Fund is designed to become the region's most enduring community asset generating sustainable, long-term funding for local not-for-profits through investment income. The \$20 million target will be built gradually over time,

supported by donations, fundraising efforts, and community partnerships.

"We know the need in our community is great and we also know that our local giving spirit is even greater," says Border Trust Executive Officer, Sue Gold.

"The Community Impact Fund is about future-proofing our region," she said.

"Imagine what local not-for-profits could achieve if they had confidence that there was a consistent stream of funding to support them to address local issues."

One of the many organisations that has benefited from Border Trust grants over the years is Albury Wodonga Regional Foodshare, which has received funding for infrastructure upgrades, upscaled emergency food relief effort projects, as well as safety equipment for

volunteers.

"We're incredibly grateful to Border Trust for their continued commitment to supporting local organisations who exist to strengthen our community," said Katrina Pawley, Foodshare CEO.

"This fund is exactly the kind of support regional not-for-profits need n that it's long-term, place-based and focused on what matters to our local community."

"The message to the community is clear - this fund will only be possible if we build it together," Ms Gold said.

"Whether you donate, fundraise or help us spread the word - every action counts.

"Like Lake Hume, the Community Impact Fund will be filled one contribution at a time and like Lake Hume, it will become a vital, lasting resource for our region," Ms Gold added.

### Burn reduces fire threat

Forest Management Victoria (FFMV) firefighters ignited a planned burn at Mt Elliot last Wednesday. Aerial ignition was used to ignite the burn and 14 Upper Murray Fire District firefighters completed the burn, supported by a local earthmoving contractor.

"The 414 hectare fuel reduction burn will help reduce the impact of bushfires on the Corryong community and surrounding environment," said Chris Hardman, Chief Fire Officer FFMV.

Crews have been patrolling the burn to ensure it is safe. So far this autumn 15 planned burns have been completed in the Upper Murray Fire District.

"Autumn typically provides our crews more opportunities to conduct planned burns, as the weather is more stable and fire behaviour tends to be more predictable," said CFO Hardman.

### Drought support needed

The Victorian Farmers Federation (VFF) is calling on the Victorian government to urgently ramp up drought support measures as farmers across the state face worsening conditions and the real threat of business failure.

With the Victorian state budget fast approaching, the VFF says the government must seize the opportunity to deliver immediate relief to drought-affected regions and invest in long-term preparedness and resilience.

The plea comes on the back of the South Australian government delivering a \$73 million drought package including direct support for farmers, small businesses and investment in water infrastructure.

The VFF also says Victoria risks falling behind and without immediate action, the impacts on regional communities and the state's vital food and fibre supply chains could be devastating.

VFF/UDV president, Bernie Free, said Victoria's farmers are facing some of the driest conditions seen in decades.

"Feed is becoming increasingly scarce, water sources are drying up and financial pressure is mounting," he said.

"We now have multiple dairy regions across the state affected.

"Without further support from the state government, we risk long-term damage not just to farming families but to entire rural communities.

"We are continuing to provide direct feedback to the Victorian government and urging stronger, immediate action to support farmers and rural communities facing one of the most challenging seasons in decades," Mr Free said.

# Festival recognises staunch supporters

At the conclusion of the recent Man From Snowy River Bush Festival two people who have been key to its success over many years were recognised for their dedication and dependability as great backers of the event.

Greg Hillier has long been an unassuming behind-the-scenes supporter of the festival and is a worthy entrant to its Hall of Legends.

"Whether it was lending a hand, providing resources or simply being there when needed, Greg's quiet support has been invaluable over the years," said board chair, Nicole Martin.

Greg became a member of the board in 2016. The following year, he took on the role of vice chairman, a position he still holds to this day.

Greg's contributions are not only in leadership but also in the tireless, hands-on work that has helped make the festival what it is today.

In 2017, 2018 and 2019, as the festival's demand for camping grew, Greg generously donated the use of his paddock on Farran Street, which became known as Clancy's Overflow.

"His willingness to offer his land to ensure the success of the festival speaks to his selflessness and commitment," Nicole said.

His company, Hillier Contracting, has also come to the festival's rescue on numerous occasions.

He has also been instrumental in the ongoing earthworks and maintenance required each year to ready the recreation

reserve for action.

Before joining the board, Greg worked on the grounds alongside his father Jack (who was made a Legend in 2010).

"Greg's dedication has always been about ensuring the festival's success, no matter how much work it took," Nicole said.

"Greg's kindness extended beyond the grounds as well. He was always willing to volunteer for any task, whether it was working the bar or helping wherever he was needed. He was often in the background, quietly giving his time and energy to make sure everything ran smoothly.

"His humility, kindness, and dedication to both the festival and the broader community make him the perfect recipient of the Legend award," Nicole added.

Another stalwart of the festival has been Robert Wheeler who was announced as the 2025 Volunteer of the Year.

In the 30 years of the festival Robert has only missed one through illness. For many years you would have found him out the back quietly swearing at everyone, trying to move stock quickly and get whatever job was required done.

"However, anyone that knows Robert would know his bark is worse than his bite," Nicole said.

"No event would get going without him!

"He is a familiar sight at the crack of dawn - smoke in mouth, dog by side - enjoying the moment before he starts berating everyone!

# Mum's community spirit passed on

After watching her mother, Lisa, work on the frontline as an Ambulance Victoria (AV) Ambulance Community Officer (ACO) in Corryong, Maisie Pilli was inspired to follow in her footsteps.

Volunteering runs deep in the Pilli family with Maisie and her siblings already being members of the Country Fire Authority (CFA).

For Maisie, donning the AV uniform was another way to give back to the community she loves.

"Mum was an ACO for many years before I even thought about joining myself and through her I got to see how rewarding it can be," she said.

"She thought I would

be another good person to do the job and there were a few things that happened that made me want to be able to provide medical help to someone in need.

"I've been on the road as an ACO for about 18 months now and it's gone so quickly, I'm really enjoying it."

ACOs are First Responders, who are employed on a casual basis to work 'on call' in rural and remote communities where the ambulance caseload is low and the ambulance branch is not staffed by full-time paramedics. They are trained to provide advanced first aid, to support qualified paramedics and can transport patients to

hospital.

An ACO of 12 years standing, Lisa said working alongside Maisie has only strengthened their bond and allowed them to learn from each other.

"It's really special being able to do this with Maisie and watching her grow in the role and develop her skills," she said.

"It's really meaningful and rewarding to be able to contribute to our close-knit community and support others when they need it most."

Maisie said her and her siblings are incredibly proud of their mother.

"It's hard to not look up to her because the number of hours she's given to the community is outstanding

"To us, she is the front-runner for community engagement and is constantly trying to get

messaging out there to help locals in any way she can."

# Processor boosts farm gate price

Saputo Dairy Australia (SDA) has advised its suppliers of a step-up in minimum milk price of \$0.15 per kgMS for the 2024/25 season.

This step up increases the weighted average farmgate milk price to \$8.30 - \$8.45 per kgMS for exclusive supply in the southern milk regions (Gippsland, South-West Victoria and South Australia, Northern region and Tasmania).

This payment will be made with April proceeds during May and automatically applied to all qualifying milk supplied under SDA's published exclusive milk supply agreements from 1 July, 2025.

Kate Ryan, Director of Milk Supply and Planning, said SDA remained committed to paying a competitive milk price.

"During the current season, we've seen

continued stabilisation of commodity prices for the start of calendar year 2025," she said.

"Meanwhile, domestic market challenges persist as cost-of-living pressures impact the local trading environment. Consumers remain cost sensitive and value focused.

"As we look to the 2025/26 season ahead, the outlook for domestic and global demand remains uncertain and volatile,

with geopolitical tensions and inflationary pressures still impacting purchasing activity."

The milk prices quoted above are a weighted average across SDA's supply base. Milk prices achieved at individual farm level will vary.
