Tilley talks big bucks for roads

Potholes and crumbling pavement are putting motorists lives at risk and the Upper Murray is a prime example, according to the Member for Benambra, Bill Tilley. As part of their

election policy the Liberal Nationals have pledged \$10 billion over the next decade to a statewide road maintenance blitz. Under the plan, the

current annual road asset management budget will be increased from around \$600 million to \$1 billion per annum. "This includes

\$10 billion investing over the coming 10 years in road maintenance funding, delivering longer-term contracts to promote innovation and give contractors certainty to invest in better

equipment," Mr Tilley said. "The state of the roads

is only second to health in the minds of people in the electorate.



"We all drive these roads, we know how bad they are.

"There are points on the Murray Valley Highway at the bottom of Keelangie Hill where you have to slow to 40km for a massive hole.

"The flat section of the Shellev-Walwa road is a hotch-potch of fixes that get washed away very time it rains.

"Look at the Up River and Gooramadda roads near Rutherglen, the temporary fixes on the Beechworth-Chiltern Road – it's a disgrace.

"I've even had people who have lost control after hitting potholes on the Hume Freeway near Wodonga," Mr Tilley added.

"Labor cut the road maintenance budget by 10 per cent when it came to government and our roads have never recovered.

"In 2017, the Auditor-General warned the Labor government of the



poor state of Victorian roads save lives and roads and the lack of accountability for funding but they have cut a further \$200 million over the past two budgets."

CUC-OM supports local students to study by distance at any Australian higher education provider and currently has more than 40 registered students who undertake courses at 18 different Australian universities and higher education providers in a multitude of courses including health, psychology, education. Notably, 53 per cent

of CUC-OM students are the first in their family to undertake higher education studies.
