

Kids help bring back track habitat

Another casualty of last summer's bushfires has been the walking/bike track from Corryong to Colac Colac where years of plantings by school children were severely impacted.

Local schools have worked with the Upper Murray Landcare network to propagate vegetation beside the track since 2014 but much of the plantings

valuable nesting habitat for birds such as parrots being lost. It was hoped that the new plantings would be a whole community activity but group sizes have been limited because of lockdown restrictions. However, small teams have been re-planting in stages over the last four weeks

and they were joined by

local school students this

week. Already, regrowth is starting to happen.

These 'amenity plantings' of patches of shrubs and wildflowers will also create habitat as they grow and attract birdlife to the area.

The school students have planted 280 native grasses into the bare patches along the track which otherwise would grow weeds.

One conversation can make a big difference

As October draws
to a close, Rural Aid
is reminding rural
communities during
Victoria Mental
Health Month that one
conversation at the right
time, with the right person,
can change everything.

Whether it's about relationships, life on the land or just not feeling 'right', having a chat can be one of the most powerful tools a farmer can utilise.

CEO of Rural Aid, John Warlters, says that Rural Aid is committed to supporting farmers and their wellbeing.

"Sometimes restoring balance in our mental wellbeing can be found just in enjoying an activity that is not farm-related for an hour," he said.

"It could be reading, riding, running or being in the garden, golfing or going fishing.

"Similarly, having a chat with the right person can change everything yet traditionally, primary producers tend to keep quiet. We're seeing a gradual shift in this sentiment and events such as drought, relationship struggles, fire, financial hurdles and even covid isolation have been catalysts for that first chat with us."

Research shows three significant factors that directly influence the delivery of counselling services within rural communities are stigma, social isolation and mental health literacy.

"We're seeing farmers becoming more and more comfortable with taking up counselling when they need it," Mr Warlters said.

"We had nearly 1600 primary producers reach out to our counselling services in the last quarter.

Some received support via phone, others face to face and also through our monthly webinars.

"Our tailored counselling program helps build emotional resilience and aims to reduce stress, depression and suicide in rural areas.

"We employ qualified, Australian Counselling Association nationallyregistered counsellors to provide mental wellbeing support services for farmers and their families.

"Our counsellors live within their communities and foster long-term relationships with farmers, farming families, community groups and other non-government organisations," Mr Warlters said.

Getting ready for the fire season

Preparations for the fire season at CFA's State Logistics Centre (SLC) are well underway as Victorians are urged to start their own preparations this Fire Action Week.

Describing the centre as a vital cog in CFA's bushfire response, Acting Chief Officer, Garry Cook, said it was ready for a new fire season after more than doubling its capacity from 3200m² to 8000m². During last year's unprecedented bushfire season, the State Logistic Centre's workload increased early with our deployment to interstate fires and was then sustained throughout the prolonged fires across the North East and East Gippsland," he said.

Eighty-five per cent of the equipment and resources used by CFA's firefighters is supplied by the SLC which carries 1900 line items, with sufficient reserves of inventory to meet the demands of a major event through the use of technology and deliberate, planned high inventory levels. Between 1 November 2019 and 31 March 2020, it shipped out more than 187,000 litres of water and 185,000 sachets of hydrate powder.



CFA units are getting extra equipment for the coming fire season.

Replenishment of personal protective clothing included 4,400 items of wildfire protective clothing, 5,700 pairs of wildfire gloves, 2,000 pairs of boots, 1,300 wildfire helmets and 6,300 goggles.

It also supplied 40,000 litres of foam concentrate and 1700 hoses plus nearly 83,000 P2 firefighting masks with an additional request for 450,000 community masks that were distributed on behalf of the federal government

Due to the current coronavirus pandemic, the CLS has also stocked and distributed more than half a million hygiene masks, 11,000 P2 masks, 124,000 pairs of disposable gloves, 4,100 litres of hand sanitiser and close to 12,000 coveralls, for CFA use only.

Prepare your plan now

Fire Week and Victorians are being urged to prepare themselves and their properties for this year's bushfire season.

With above average rain fall forecast from now to December, this year's fire season has the potential to be grassfiredominated, with shorterduration fires in grass and dry forests during hotter and windier days

CFA Acting Chief Officer, Garry Cook, said any bushfire season in Victoria has the potential to be a bad one and warned against complacency.

"Fire Action Week is a great reminder to Victorians to get a better understanding of their fire risk and what to do about it," he said.

your "Preparing property means you minimise the chance of property damage during a fire, even if you plan to leave early.

"Keep overhanging branches and shrubs to a minimum near your home and keep grass shorter than 10cm," Mr Cook advised.

"Move your winter wood pile away from the house and clear debris from gutters.

"A big clean-up before the fire season can make a huge difference to the safety and survival of your home in a bushfire.

"You also need to plan and prepare for your personal safety by understanding your risk and having a fire plan.

"Plan for all situations by talking to your family and friends about your triggers to leave, where you'll go and how you'll get there.

"Get into the habit checking Fire Danger Ratings on the VicEmergency website or app daily to understand the fire risk in your area," he added.

"It's up to all of us to stay informed by using more than one source of information, understanding the three levels of warnings, what they mean and what you should do."

In the lead-up to summer, CFA will be Fire Safety running Essentials online sessions help Victorians understand their fire risk and help you prepare. Check What's On in your

Air fleet returns to the firefight

A record 51 aircraft will hit Victorian skies to help fight fires and keep communities safe this summer season.

Minister for Police and Emergency Services, Lisa Neville, has announced the 2020-21 aircraft fleet which includes a mix of water bombing aircraft, air supervision and air intelligence gathering aircraft.

Two large air tankers, - which can carry up to 15,000 litres of water, foam or retardant - and two 7500 litre aircranes will contribute to the 51-strong core fleet and provide essential support to other aircraft across the state, some of which will be based at the firefighting facility at Corryong airport.

The fleet includes a number of specialist night vision-enabled aircraft, which can conduct firebombing and intelligence operations after dark and has a surge capacity of up to 100 that can support the Victorian core fleet and be called upon when needed.

Victoria's emergency services are preparing for a normal fire season across the state, however the location, timing and amount of spring rainfall is likely to affect fire potential.

"Victoria's aerial

firefighting fleet will return bigger than ever to support our hard-working firefighters and ensure that Victoria has the strongest possible fire response, both in the air and on the ground, as we head into fire season," Ms Neville said. Last fire season we saw just how critical aircraft were in responding to fires and protecting life and property, not just in remote areas but right across the state."

Aircraft will provide an immediate response across the state, allowing water bombing aircraft to respond to fires at the same time as fire trucks.

The Victorian fleet was critical in stopping the spread of fire last summer, providing an initial attack from the air in the early stages of fires and supporting firefighters on the ground, including across the North East and East Gippsland.

"Our forest firefighters do a fantastic job on the ground and our record number of aircraft will support that effort," added Minister for Energy, Environment and Climate Change, Lily D'Ambrosio.

Stay tuned during disasters

During last summer's bushfires and the recent blackouts, the ABC transmitter on Mt Elliot (99.7MHz) continued to operate due to the fitting of a large battery.

Its run time is about 30 hours and all you need to hear the latest updates is a battery powered radio - either a small transistor radio or a car / tractor radio.
