Haines makes case for budget funding

Additional mobile phone towers in the Upper Murray are among the priority items that the Member for Indi, Helen Haines, has included in her case for significant investment in the electorate in her submission to the government ahead of the October budget.

After working in partnership with local councils, regional development stakeholders and others, Dr Haines has submitted detailed proposals for funding across Indi.

Educators needed to shore up childcare services

Attracting qualified and passionate staff to deliver children's services in Corryong is key to ensuring that families from the Upper Murray have access to an ongoing service, according to Towong Shire Council.

"Council recognises there is significant community concern regarding limited access to early years services, particularly childcare and outside of school and holiday care in the Upper Murray," said Towong mayor, Cr Andrew Whitehead. "Council has been working closely with Corryong College, Peekaboo Child Care Centre and the community to address concerns regarding the limited availability of childcare. While there is a strong commitment from all parties, the inability to

attract appropriately qualified staff has meant that a solution is yet to be found to ensure services continue and sadly, there is a very real risk that without additional staff, services will cease.

"Delivering children's services in rural communities is challenging. Being a small community located so far from the regional centre of Albury Wodonga means that it is difficult to attract and retain qualified staff."

"Over many years there has been no shortage of attempts by Peekaboo to offer a range of incentives including overseas migration options, to attract suitably qualified staff to the Upper Murray," Cr Whitehead added.

"Council has also been advertising online for early years roles over the past few months. While we

have had a small number of qualified applicants, most of whom are now employed by council in our existing services, we still have not had enough interest to help support a viable childcare option in the Upper Murray."

Cr Whitehead also said this is not the first time communities from Towong Shire have been faced with this difficulty.

"In December 2018, the communities of Bellbridge and Bethanga faced an almost immediate closure of their existing service," he said.

"Thankfully, in the weeks leading up to Christmas, council was able to secure the staff required to continue the services. We were able to employ staff from Albury Wodonga and the surrounding areas on that occasion.



"Unfortunately, finding staff for the Upper Murray has been far more difficult. It is a wonderful place to live and work and if you or anyone you know is looking for new career opportunities council is seeking people with a passion for early years education with qualifications including certificates, diplomas or bachelor's degrees in early childhood education or

youth."

For those looking to enter the sector a competitive traineeship program, with support in place to help them succeed is also available.

"In the last Parliament I worked hand in hand with the community to ensure Indi's funding needs were front and centre at budget time and you can be assured this will continue in the new

Parliament," Dr Haines said.

"Indi is facing serious challenges regarding health care and housing but we also have momentous opportunities for investment to fuel regional development. The

Indi Budget Submission calls on the government to address areas of need and boost projects that will help our towns reach their potential.

"I have worked with local councils and community groups to

put these projects to the government, to ensure the projects that are most needed and will have the most impact are at the front of the queue."

Dr Haines has continued the push for Federal funding to be

contributed to a new hospital for Albury Wodonga.

"In my first conversation with Prime Minister Anthony Albanese I told him we needed a new hospital on the border and the Federal government needed to stump up funding alongside the Victorian and NSW state governments," she said.

"We need a world-class hospital on the border to serve the North East region and ensure people can get the care they need, close to home."

Dr Haines has also advocated to the government for other critical infrastructure, including \$5 million for new and upgraded mobile phone towers at Burrowye and Shelley in Towong Shire.

"The project will establish sub-networks at the edge of the existing telecommunications network providing connection to householders in remote valleys," Dr Haines said.

"It will have a major impact on the resilience and safety of some of the Victoria's most bushfire prone areas."

Dr Haines also identified housing affordability and availability as an issue across Indi, with increased rates of homelessness and many employers reporting they can't find workers due to the lack of accommodation. In the last Parliament, Dr Haines launched the Regional Housing Infrastructure Fund policy to provide funding for regional councils and utilities to remove barriers to opening up new land.

"I'm making sure the Treasurer knows we need a \$2 billion fund to open up more land for housing," she said.

"Policy to address the housing crisis in Australia needs to be more than help for first home buyers to save a deposit.

Young boxers get set to glove up

A bushfire recovery grant will be used to kick-start a boxing program to support local youth who are missing out on playing football because of the lack of an age-appropriate competition.

Stuart Spratt and Rotary Club of Corryong member, Matthew Spurgeon, identified that there was a gap to be filled to cater for young boys who were no longer eligible to play junior football once they were too old for the Under 14 competition, as the next step up was to reserves level.

Stuart brainstormed ideas for alternative youth activities to fill that void with his 'Soldier On' connections and the framework for the Corryong Boxing Group was formed.

The Rotary Club of

Corryong auspiced the project and thanks to a generous community grant of \$44,832 from Border Trust the program is set to kick off.

"We plan on accepting boys as they graduate from the Under 14 competition and build their strength, hand-eye co-ordination, confidence and maturity before they return to the senior ranks of the Upper Murray league as young men ready to take on the world," Stuart said.

"Well, at least to take on Cudgewa, Bullioh, Federals, Corryong or Tumbarumba as the case may be," Matthew chimed in.

Boxing classes are set to start in October in the old squash courts located in Jardine Street.

Along with boxing equipment the grant will

fund professional coaches out of Albury Wodonga.

"A very special thanks must go to the owners of the squash courts for their support," Matthew added.

"Of course an open invitation is extended to Upper Murray boxing stalwarts to become involved including but not limited to Bill Ellis, Terry Liston, Benny Byatt and others.

"We will soon set up a Facebook page and those people interested can check training times and pop in.

"However, the boys better get in quick as we have received expressions of interest from young and older girls who are already lining up to take classes!

"We will certainly be looking at introducing women-only boxing fitness classes down the track.

Generator boosts club capability

The Corryong Lions Club has used a \$5000 grant from the Towong Shire Council under its Community Recovery program to purchase a Honda generator to assist with its activities. The unit will be used for club catering at community events and will also be available in times of emergency.

Energy initiative gives residents an edge

The Upper Murray Energy Resilience and Reliability Project directly addresses the reliability, vulnerability and variability of the local electricity supply and includes a component to create a Corryong-focused microgrid.

The Department of Land, Water and Planning (DELWP), in partnership with AusNet and Mondo, is running Project Edge - Community Microgrids and Sustainable Energy Program.

Australia is leading the world in the installation of rooftop solar and has a growing appetite for electric vehicles. Together these types of technologies are known as Distributed Energy Resources (DER).

However, the energy systems which exist today were not designed for DER - they were designed for one-way flows of electricity from large-scale generators to consumers. This means that the full value of renewables and DER are not being fully realised by Australian households and businesses.

A single household solar system only generates a very small amount of electricity in comparison to a large power station, however if hundreds or even thousands of households

could combine their solar output they could potentially compete with the output of a traditional power station.

The program in the Upper Murray is to install subsidised solar and battery and smart control systems on up to 50 homes in Corryong as part of a broader project to improve the disaster resilience of three fire affected communities of Corryong, Omeo and Mallacoota.

The overall package of program is forecast to be \$7M for all three towns. More details of this program can be found

The Upper Murray Energy Resilience and Reliability Project is funded by the Victorian government through Bushfire Recovery

Victoria (BRV) and Regional Development Victoria (RDV). Upper Murray Inc. is responsible for the project, working in partnership with Indigo Power as the project management team.

Firewood collection period opens

Residents in the Upper Murray district are being urged to start planning their firewood needs in the lead up to the opening of the spring collection period. From today designated firewood collection areas on public land will open across Victoria, allowing communities to gather wood for personal use.

Forest Fire Management Victoria (FFMVic) Upper Murray District Manager, Dave Jenson, said community firewood depots, which were opened following the 2019-20 fires utilising firewood generated from recovery works, are now closed.

"We want to remind the community that firewood can only be taken from designated collection areas during collection periods and is for personal use only and cannot be sold,"

Mr Jenson said.

"With the closing of the firewood depots, we have opened additional roadside collection areas.

"Designated collection areas are selected for a range of reasons including the availability of firewood, community safety and to protect sites of cultural and environmental significance.

"Collection limits include taking a maximum of two cubic metres per person per day and a maximum of 16 cubic metres per household per financial year."

Conservation Regulator Authorised Officers will be patrolling in state forests and targeting anyone attempting to take firewood illegally.

Those caught breaking the rules can face on-the-spot fines of up to \$740,

and serious offences can result in maximum penalties of \$9,246 or up to a year in prison.

The opening of some collection areas may be delayed due to the seasonally wet conditions.

The spring season closes on November 30, 2022.

Financial assistance is available for concession card holders and people on low incomes who rely on purchasing firewood. More information about this support can be found at <https://www.ffm.vic.gov.au/firewood/energy-concession-and-support>.

- Emperor Track- Use Murray Valley Highway/ Edgar Road at Koetong, 5kms southwest of Koetong.

- Cravensville Roadside - Use Murray Valley Highway/ Edgar Road at Koetong or Cravensville Rd, 4kms southwest of Koetong.



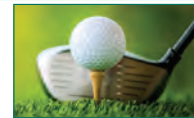

Cudgewa takes a 2-1 advantage over Bullioh into Saturday's preliminary final for the right to take on Tumbarumba in the premiership decider.

difficult to contain and on their home deck Cudgewa gets the nod.

The A grade netball final pitches two powerhouses in recent times - Cudgewa and Federals - against each other in what should be a classic match.

The Blues lowered their colours against Tumbarumba in the second semi and the Swans have been in good form in the latter part of the season

but Cudgewa has had the wood over their opposition this season and should progress to get another crack at the Roos.

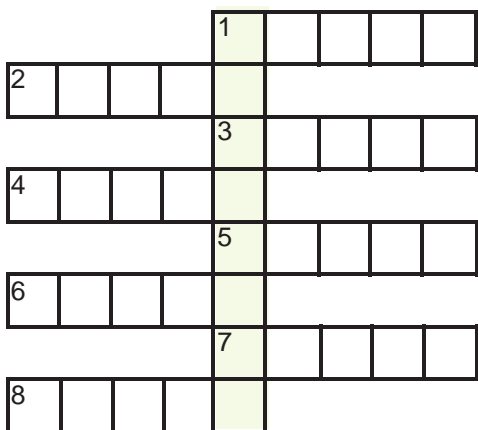

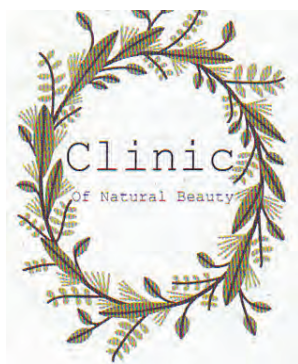
