Rural areas deserve a fair share

Tania Maxwell MP has called on the Premier, Daniel Andrews, to give the northern Victorian communities a fair share of health funding after the government announced a \$1 billion package for

the Austin and Northern hospitals in Melbourne's north.

The Member for Northern Victoria said regional people continued to be left behind, with Parliamentary Budget Office costings done for her Derryn Hinch's Justice Party confirming regional communities are 11 per cent worse off than metropolitan communities when it comes to asset investment.

Ms Maxwell said the people she represents

were waiting on important health investment commitments, including a new Mildura hospital and new Albury Wodonga Health single-site hospital, redevelopment funding for Swan Hill, Daylesford and Bright hospitals and sustained funding for Euroa Health.

"The government needs to recognise and invest in hospital and health services in the north of the state, not just the north of Melbourne," Ms Maxwell said.

"Albury Wodonga Health has established a clear case for a new hospital, the community has been campaigning for the past year and the government continues to stall on a commitment.

"Northern Victoria deserves a fair share of the pie when it comes to election commitments and if the government can prioritise an announcement for the Melbourne's north, it should expedite an announcement for the north of our state."

Roadside funding announced

Member for Northern Victoria, Jaclyn Symes, has announced the state government is investing through the Roadside Weeds and Pests Control Program to support rural

and regional councils across the north east.

Under the program Towong Shire Council will received \$36,869.

Weeds and pests cost the Victorian economy

over \$900 million each year by disrupting agricultural production, damaging native biodiversity and contributing to the spread of fires.

The funding will assist councils with a range of activities along their rural roadsides including treating and preventing 'regionally controlled' and 'restricted' weeds, managing rabbit populations and community consultation.

"This funding will support our local councils to carry out important work that protects our rural communities from invasive weeds and pests," Ms Symes said.

Club focuses on community connection

The facilities at The Club Corryong will be greatly enhanced by a \$165,000 upgrade of the outdoor area and connection to the current clubhouse social area after it received a bushfire recovery grant from Border Trust.

Following the 2019-20 Black Summer bushfires, the Corryong Sporting Complex board identified that it could support community recovery by improving general well-being and re-building social connections by creating an enhanced family orientated outdoor space, with protection from the elements for the enjoyment of the wider community.

The works will be funded by a \$100,000 grant through round two of the Border Trust's Towong Community Bushfire Disaster Relief Fund with the balance being financed by the club.

The major improvement will be the construction of a covered outdoor dining area, connected to the current club social area, which will significantly expand the space for patrons

and induce greater use of the facilities as well as providing safer dining in the current and future pandemic era.

"The club has managed its assets ably for many years on a tight budget," said club president, Shane Blake.

"It has had no capital works program or external funding for at least the last 30 years and has not been successful in other bushfire recovery grant applications made to date.

"Time and the elements had taken a toll on our facilities, specifically the outdoor decking area. The timber has begun to deteriorate, creating a safety risk.

"Other minor works needed to be undertaken to meet changed construction standards and OH&S requirements since it was first built, such as external

stair access.

"The present dining and bar facilities will be significantly improved by this extension and the enhanced decking and undercover area also has social and golf related benefits.

"In regional communities there is a heightened need for locals to meet and socialise on a casual basis and the grant from Border Trust will ensure the club is an ideal venue for both families and others to socialise in a friendly atmosphere.

"On behalf of our more than 350 members I would like to thank Border Trust for their wonderful support and the confidence they have shown in the club to continue to meet the needs of our community," he said.

The project aligns with the overall

community recovery priorities of strengthening community resilience; supporting mental health recovery; increasing social connections; and developing industry and business opportunities including tourism facilities.

A primary purpose of the club is to operate and manage the town's golf course and the revitalisation project will also foster patronage of the facility and the sport.

The works will include a new and larger deck and construction of a secure storage area below to house new golf carts the club will purchase for hire purposes.

An engineer's report has been commissioned for the works and a the next stage will be to complete the design plan.

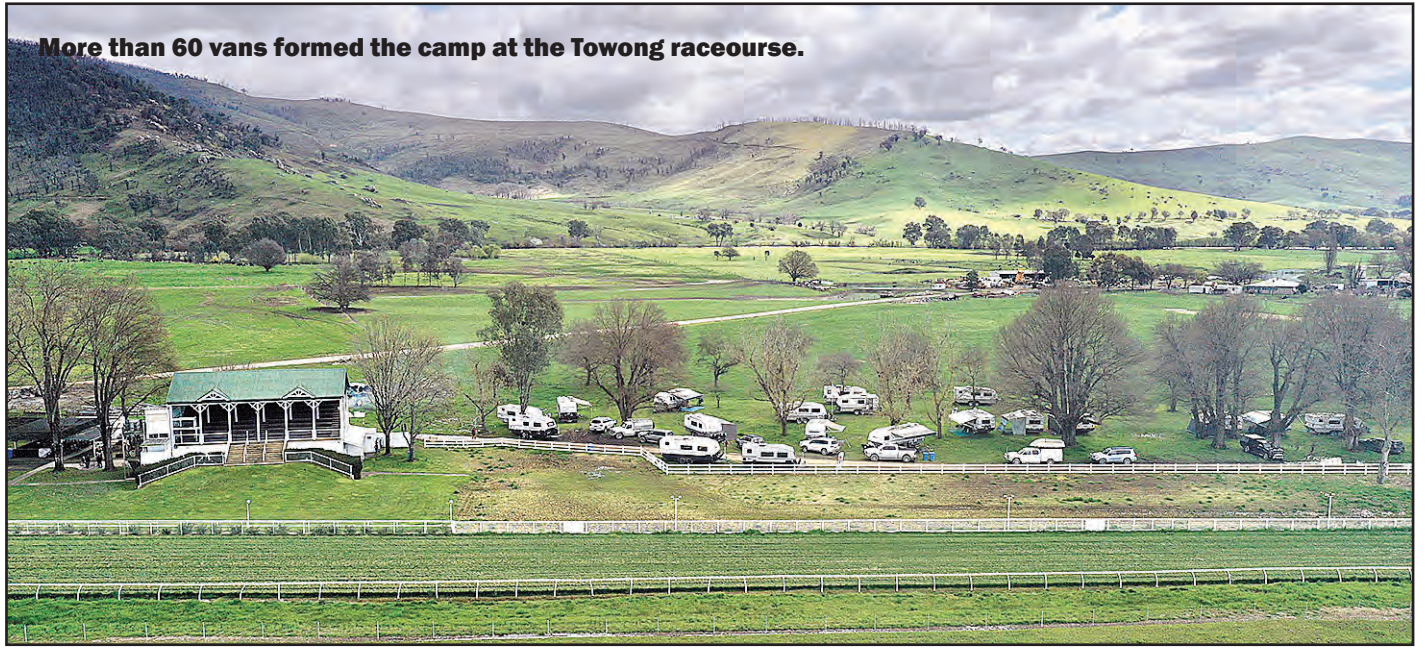

Caravanners contribute to local economy

The Upper Murray recently hosted 120 members of the Bushtrackers Owners' Group (BOG) who visited the area in 61 caravans and two motorhomes for their annual Muster.

During their 10 days at the event, a significant amount of money was injected into the town and surrounding district.

Committee operational costs at local businesses and organisations to run the muster totalled \$24,300 which included expenditure with the Towong Recreation Reserve, bus hire, Lions Club for catering and hall hire, IGA supermarket for supplies, Corryong Football Netball Club, liquor outlets, butchery, other caterers and entertainment.

In addition, donations to local and other organisations from money raised by raffles and auctions totalled \$13,200. Recipients included

Corryong Health (electric shower chair), Corryong College (towards the student social), Thrive (vests and caps for money raising activities), Melanoma Institute, Cancer Council, RFDS (annual donation), Jane McGrath Foundation (annual donation), Prostate Research (annual donation) and a local farmer for assistance in extracting caravans from the mud!

Local and regional spending by individuals throughout the muster was estimated in the order of \$59,000. This

is based on expenditure sheets provided by 39 of the 63 vans in attendance, providing an average spend per member.

In total, the town

and immediate region received an injection of approximately \$96,400 from the members of the Bushtracker Owners Group.

"It was money well spent in a very beautiful part of Australia, despite the rain," said 'chief wrangler' of the muster, Graham Watson.

Community grants announced

Live theatre, murals, sporting equipment, a storage shed and clubhouse renovations are just some of the projects receiving funding through Snowy Valleys Council's 2022/23 Community Grants Program.

Nineteen applications valued at \$134,335 were received through the Strengthening Grants stream with thirteen projects approved for funding to the value of

\$60,000.

The Capital Sports Grants stream received seven applications to the value of \$56,132 and six projects were approved for funding to the value of \$40,000.

Mayor Cr Ian Chaffey congratulated the successful applicants for their community-mindedness and endeavouring to enhance the experience of living in the Snowy Valleys.

"There were strong contenders for the allocated funds and I think we have a very rewarding outcome with a good apportion across the whole region," he said.

Projects from across the region successful in receiving grant monies are:

Among the successful Community Strengthening Grants was the Jingellic Hub which received \$5773 for local heritage markers.

The Tumbarumba

Golf Club received \$3499 for a conference and training centre while the Tumbarumba Little Athletics Club will spend \$7775 on high jump mats.

Upper Murray Community Radio will benefit by \$892 for the purchase of furniture and equipment.

Under the Capital Sports Grants program the Tumbarumba Golf Club will received \$10,000 for renovations.

Courthouse undergoes a makeover

An extensive rehabilitation of the Corryong Magistrates' Court is expected to continue until the end of the year.



The works currently being undertaken include stump repairs; a new roof, gutters and downpipes; and external ramp repairs.

External painting including repairs to weatherboards and internal painting including plaster repairs are also part of the renovations.

Refurbishment of the internal and external toilet amenities and construction

of new footpaths are also included in the works.

The courthouse is protected under a Heritage Overlay in the Towong Planning scheme but the

building is not registered on the Heritage Council Victoria's database.

The cost of the current work is approximately \$150,000.

Police snippet from days past

The story of a Walwa policeman who retrieved a body from a mine was recently posted in a Police Veterans Victoria blog under the heading 'Brave in Blue'.

Suffocating, due to a partial shaft cave-in, Edward Ernest Edmond Murphy (58) was not immediately missed, after apparently overbalancing and falling 20 feet down the shaft on 16 September, 1949.

Reaching the Fluorspa mine shaft, 12 miles from the north-east Victoria River Murray town of Walwa, about 5.15p.m., First Constable Tom

O'Halloran located, about 50 metres from the mine entrance, the body of Edward Murphy.

Unfortunately, he could do nothing for the entombed miner, other than secure a rope to an exposed leg before being hauled to the top to obtain necessary burrowing implements.

Deciding to attempt retrieval by tunnelling from a lower shaft, Tom O'Halloran was again lowered to successfully retrieve the remains of Edward Murphy, about 10pm. that night.

For his bravery in retrieving the body First

Constable O'Halloran 9022 was awarded a Royal Humane Society of Australasia Bronze Medal - Virtute Paratum - Bravery Rewarded.

Fifty-five years of age, Richmond Victoria, born Thomas Andrew O'Halloran, son of Elisa Christine Miller and William Joseph O'Halloran. Died at Wangaratta, Victoria in 1966 as a result of a motor vehicle accident.

Footnote:- O'Halloran was a long serving officer at Walwa and some years after this incident Senior Constable Jack Hallinan took over his position as O.I.C. Walwa.

Be prepared and not scared

The community is being reminded that now spring has arrived, native birds such as magpies and masked lapwings may begin swooping during their breeding season but there are steps people can take to remain safe at this time.



Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) Senior Wildlife Projects Officer, Therese Davis, said some native birds swoop to defend their eggs and young for the six to eight weeks until they leave the nest.

“Swooping can catch us by surprise but it is normal behaviour for some territorial birds,” Ms Davis said.

“Swooping is basically a scare tactic to warn people and animals not to come near their nesting young. Birds may swoop people or animals, so be mindful of your dogs too.

“However, not all birds swoop to protect their

eggs and young during the breeding season, so don't be concerned simply because there are magpies or other common swooping birds in the area.

“During this time of year less than 10 per cent of birds actually swoop and even fewer make contact. If you are worried about being swooped, you can do a few things to protect yourself.”

Tips to avoid being swooped:-

- Know your local swooping hotspots
- Avoid the area if possible
- Move quickly, but do

not run
• Cover your head with a hat, helmet or umbrella, but don't wave it around

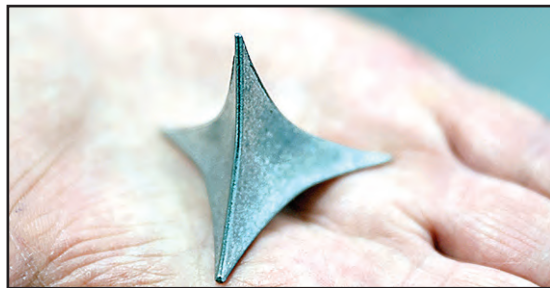
• Do not harass or feed birds

To plan your route around known swooping hotspots or to report a swooping incident on Victoria's interactive swooping bird map visit <https://www.wildlife.vic.gov.au/managing-wildlife/swooping-birds>

All Victorian native wildlife is protected by law and it is illegal to harass or harm native birds and other wildlife without authorisation.

Keep an eye out for tyre spikes

Young rider sets the bar high

Corryong was well represented at the Melbourne Royal Show 2022 by Matilda Jackson and her Heritage Australian Stock Horse 'Camelot Final Impression'. Competing across Lead, Hack and Working classes the pair returned three 2nd placings. Matilda, aged just 15, has exceeded expectations in the Australian Stock Horse world following her many years of Stockman's Challenge participation. Matilda made the decision to follow her dreams and move into the breeding, training

and showing of the Australian stock horse in early 2022 and made the heartbreaking decision to move on her Challenge horse 'Kialla Park Ex Factor', which she had outgrown, to finance the purchase of 'Camelot Final Impression', fondly known as 'Fin'.

"Most people would think we purchased this horse with Dad's cheque book but absolutely not!" Matilda emphasised.

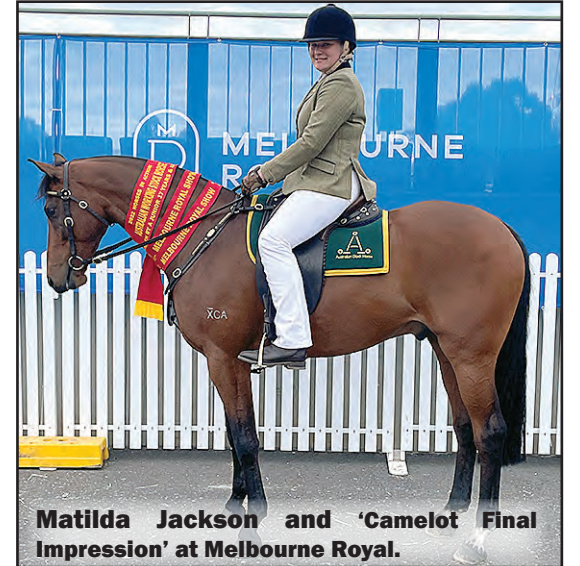
"I paid for him myself with the proceeds from the sale of my horse 'Ex'."

Matilda's first event on 'Fin' was at the Sydney Royal Easter Show back in April where she got to know the horse better, albeit at one of the biggest shows in the country, placing top 10 in all of her classes. She has worked extremely hard in getting him ready for the Melbourne Royal while juggling boarding school at St Pauls in Walla Walla and training on the weekends and any spare moment she gets.

"Fin is a fantastic horse to ride," Matilda said.

"To be successful you need to have a bond with your horse and Fin and I have quickly become best mates and understand each other."

"Sydney was a huge show and I learnt a lot which I think helped

me in preparation for Melbourne. It's like Fin knows it's time to shine and certainly had his game face on in Melbourne.

"I placed 2nd across three events in the Australian Stock Horse category including Open Hack 4-years & Over 15HH, Junior Hack ridden by a junior and my favourite event, the Working Class (Junior)."

"The days are huge at the big events and I'm up at 4am and don't get to bed until 10:30pm most nights. My parents are a huge support to me and I simply couldn't do this without them. There are a lot of laughs on the road in the truck and the time they put in is huge considering their other commitments."

"I'm lucky enough

to have had some great coaching across my horse life from Gay Erickson at Jingellic and recently with the breeder of Camelot Final Impression, Paul Davidson from Orange.

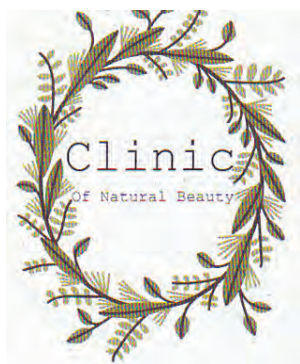

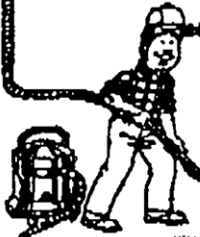
